

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R E P O R T, 1877.

THE estimated population for this year was 527,083, and for 1878, 532,681, giving an estimated increase of 5,598 ; the natural increase by deducting 18,904 deaths from 20,338 births is 6,429 for the year 1877, being 831 over the estimated increase.

Notwithstanding the prevalence of Hooping Cough and Small Pox, the health of the Town has been on the whole satisfactory ; for once only during a long period has the death rate been lower, namely in 1873, when it was 25.8 per 1,000, whilst for this year the rate was 26.4, being 1.1 lower than the year 1876, and 2.9 lower than the average of the previous ten years. The most fatal of the zymotic diseases was Hooping Cough, which occasioned 735 deaths. The deaths of Infants below five years of age were 6,341, and comprised 45.6 per cent. of the whole deaths.

It is very gratifying to observe the growing interest which the Public take in sanitary matters, and in no way is it more manifested than in their willingness to furnish information of the existence of infectious disease, and the desire to have the assistance of the Sanitary Authority to disinfect their premises and clothing as a preventive measure. This will be apparent from the number of cases of infectious disease, 3,876, reported during the year, and which included 1,660 cases of Small Pox, 1,414 of Fever, 493 of Scarlatina, 250 of Measles, and 59 of Diphtheria.

To prevent the spread of disease by the assembling of large numbers of children in the public schools, an arrangement was made with the School Board that, when a house was reported to be infected by zymotic disease, a Sanitary Inspector should visit it, and ascertain if any children were attending school. This information was to be communicated to the School Board, and notice sent to the Head Master of the school at which the children attended ; the children would be then released from school duties until their homes had been thoroughly cleansed and disinfected. This arrangement was found to work very satisfactorily, and, meeting the approval of teachers and parents, has now been extended to all schools within the Borough.

Dr. Archer, Assistant Medical Officer of Mill Road Hospital, has kindly furnished returns of 1,021 cases of Small Pox admitted into that Institution from the end of May, 1876, to February, 1877. Of the total number of cases, 158 or 15.5 per cent died, and comprised patients who were vaccinated 731,

of whom 45 died, or 6·2 per cent., unvaccinated 218, of whom 100 died, or 45·9 per cent., and doubtful cases 72, of whom 13 died, or 18·1 per cent. Allowing the same proportion of unvaccinated to the vaccinated as given in Dr. Seaton's report to the Local Government Board for the year 1874, namely, four out of every one hundred persons, it will be found that out of the 506,000 vaccinated, 731 cases, or 14·4 per 10,000, were sent to Hospital, and of these 0·9 per 10,000 died, or less than one person for every 10,000 vaccinated. Of the 21,083 unvaccinated, 218 or 103·4 per 10,000, were sent to Hospital, and 47·4 per 10,000 of the unvaccinated died. To state the subject plainly, it may be fairly assumed that there were 4,000 cases of Small Pox during the epidemic of 1876 and 1877 within the Borough, and of every 10,000 vaccinated persons 57·7 had the disease and 3·6 died, and of every 10,000 unvaccinated persons 413·6 had the disease and 189·7 died. If we add the doubtful to the vaccinated, out of every 10,000 63 had the disease and 4·6 died. On further reference to the returns it will be observed that the number of vaccinated cases under 16 years of age (when revaccination is generally performed) is very large, and suggests the propriety of revaccination at a much earlier period.

The reduction in the deaths from Diarrhoea and Fever during the last twelve years affords very satisfactory evidence of the beneficial character of the sanitary operations during that period.

During the fifty-two weeks of the year 1877 (terminating on Saturday, December 29), the Returns of the Local Registrars record 20,333 births, and 13,904 deaths within the Borough; the numbers for the corresponding period of the previous year, 1876, were 20,426 births and 14,347 deaths.

Of the births 10,299 were males, and 10,034 were females, making the total birth rate of the Borough equal to 38·6 per 1,000; the average of the previous ten years being 38·1 per 1,000.

DEATHS.

Of the 13,904 deaths, 7,217 were of males, and 6,687 of females; 7,022 occurred in the Parish, and 6,882 in the Out-townships.

The Death-rate of the Borough was equal to 26·4 per 1,000. The average of the previous ten years was 29·3 per 1,000.

The following table shows the actual number of deaths registered in the Parish and Out-townships, previous to the transference to the districts from whence the patients were removed, of the deaths occurring in the Workhouses and Hospitals. The Death-rate of the Parish was equal to 31·8, and that of the Out-townships to 21·3, per 1,000 of the population.

From the returns made as to the residences of persons dying in the Workhouses and Hospitals of the town, we are able to classify 1,694 of the deaths in these establishments under the wards and districts from whence the patients were removed, viz., 340 under Scotland Ward, 145 under Vauxhall Ward, 147 under St. Paul's and Exchange Wards (Dale Street District), 283 under St. Anne's and Lime Street Wards (Islington District), 26 under Castle Street and St. Peter's Wards (St. George's District), 116 under Pitt Street and Great George's Wards (St. Thomas's District), 143 under Rodney Street and Abercromby Wards (Mount Pleasant District), 198 under the Out-towship of Everton, 70 under that of Kirkdale, 126 under that of West Derby, and 100 under those of the Toxteths. This will leave unclassified 264 deaths of persons whose previous residences were either unknown or not specified;

and these, in the absence of definite information, have been placed in the Wards in proportion to the number of total deaths; and 164 who were residents outside the Borough.

The results of the alterations occasioned by this re-arrangement of the deaths in the wards and districts will be shown in the following table, from which a calculated rate of mortality per 1,000 of the estimated inhabitants has been made; but it must be observed that the estimate of the population of all the districts in the Parish has been made on a rate of decrease which is probably in excess of what is going on.

The deaths of Infants below the fifth year of their age amounted to 6,341, and thus comprised 45·6 per cent. of the whole deaths; the average number for the preceding ten years was 7,197, and the average per centage 48·3.

ZYMOTICS.

This class of diseases occasioned 2,933 deaths during the year 1877, and accounted for 21·1 per cent. of the total mortality within the Borough during the same period. The average number of deaths from these diseases for the preceding ten years was 3,919, and the percentage death rate for 1877 was 4·8 per cent. less than the proportional rate of zymotic deaths to deaths from all causes during the preceding decennial period. TYPHUS AND INFANTILE REMITTENT FEVER.

These diseases accounted for 382 deaths within the Borough of Liverpool, or for 254 in the Parish and 128 in the Out-Townships (The average number of deaths for the preceding ten years was 569). The rate of their mortality was equal to 0·7 per 1,000 of the estimated population. Their percentage rate relatively to deaths from all causes was 3·8 during the first, 2·3 during the second, 2·4 during the third, and 2·4 during the fourth quarter of the year. Their annual rate relatively to deaths from all causes was 2·7 per cent., and relatively to deaths from zymotic causes 13·0 per cent. Their deaths included 199 males and 183 females; 128 persons below the age of 15, 84 between the ages of 15 and 30, and 170 above the age of 30.

Every form of continued fever is included under the generic term of typhus; but the registers of deaths attribute 7 cases to gastric fever, 81 to typhoid fever, 28 to enteric fever, 6 to continued fever, 2 to relapsing fever, 2 to brain fever, 1 to eruptive fever, and 203 to typhus. Under the term of fever there were registered 34 deaths, under that of febris 4 deaths, and under that of febricula 5 deaths. The deaths registered under the term of infantile remittent amounted to 9.

The following tables are in themselves sufficiently explanatory. The first compares the averages of deaths from typhus during the preceding ten years with those during 1877; the second and third tables show the districts of the town and the periods of the year in which all forms of continued fever were most fatally prevalent; the fourth marks in streets the habitats of the disease; and the remaining tables the occupations and positions of its victims.

DEATHS FROM TYPHUS AND INFANTILE REMITTENT FEVER IN 1871.

Scarlatina accounted during the year for 225 deaths, or for 114 in the Parish, and 111 in the Out-townships. (The average number of deaths for the preceding ten years was 716). The rate of its mortality was equal to 0·4 per 1,000 of the estimated population. Its rate relatively to deaths

from all causes was 1·4 per cent. in the first quarter, 0·6 in the second, 1·5 in the third, and 3·0 in the fourth quarter of the year; its annual rate relatively to all deaths was 1·6 per cent., and relatively to deaths from zymotic causes 7·7 per cent.

SMALL-POX.

This disease occasioned 299 deaths in the Borough of Liverpool, or 37 in the Parish and 262 in the Out-Townships (not apportioning the deaths in Hospitals to the Wards from whence they came). Of these deaths 165 were males and 134 females, 102 were children below 5 years of age, 34 were persons between the ages of 5 and 15, 102 between the ages of 15 and 30, and 61 above the age of 30. The rate of its mortality was equal to 0·6 per 1,000

per annum of the estimated population. Its rate of mortality relatively to deaths from all causes was 4·8 per cent. in the first quarter, 2·1 per cent. in the second quarter, 1·2 in the third quarter, and 0·2 in the fourth quarter of the year. Its annual rate relatively to all deaths was 2·2 per cent. Its annual rate of mortality relatively to total deaths from Zymotic causes was 10·2 per cent.; or 27·6 per cent. during the first quarter, 12·2 during the second quarter, 4·2 during the third quarter, and 1·1 during the fourth quarter. Of the deaths, 62 were stated to be of persons who had been vaccinated, 112 not vaccinated, and there were no returns of 125.

TUBERCULAR DISEASES.

This group of diseases includes Phthisis, Scrofula, Tabes Mesenterica, and Hydrocephalus. They occasioned 1,943 deaths in the Borough of Liverpool during the year 1877, of which 965 occurred in the Parish, and 978 in the Out-Townships. (The average number of deaths for the preceding ten years was 2,073). The death-rate was 3·7 per 1,000 of the estimated population; their per-cent-age death-rate relatively to deaths from all causes was 14·0.

The Select Vestry are kind enough to forward to the Office a daily list of the cases of Fever and Small Pox attended by the Parochial Medical Officers, and a monthly list of the cases of all Zymotic diseases, of Tubercular diseases, and of sickness from other causes, which have occurred in the twelve districts of the Parish.

The daily list enables the Health Committee to take action for the purification of the houses, and I am able from the other to classify the districts and streets in which sickness has prevailed.

These show that the average number of persons suffering from Continued Fever (including therein Typhus, Typhoid, and simple Continued Fever) at one time in Hospital during the year 1877 was 60, and their percentage death-rate was 13·2. The average number of cases of Measles at one time in Hospital during the year was 2, and the percentage death-rate was 14·9; the average number of cases of Scarlatina at one time in Hospital during the year was 4, and the percentage death-rate was 11·5. Only 14 cases of Small-pox were admitted during the year, the remaining Parish cases being sent to Mill Road Hospital.

The number of persons in receipt of Parochial Relief on Saturday, 30th of June, 1877, was 5,377, or 174 more than at the corresponding period of 1876, and the number on Saturday, the 29th December, 1877, was 5,904, or 415 more than at the same period of 1876.

LODGING-HOUSES.

The Health Committee have, since the passing of the Sanitary Act, 1866, ruled that, as far as possible, all registered lodging-houses should have a day apartment for the accommodation of their lodgers, and that all houses where single rooms were occupied by day and night should be registered as sub-let. The space required for a night lodger in a registered lodging-house is 300 cubical feet, while the space in a sub-let house for each adult is 350 feet.

There were on the register 1,046 lodging houses at the end of 1876, and 1,130 at the end of 1877. This difference was occasioned by the removal of 279 old licenses, and the addition of 363 new ones. The visits to lodging-houses are both by day and night. The lodging-houses of the better class, and especially those provided only with single beds for each person, and only with the number of beds equivalent to the number of lodgers allowed, are not visited at night except on grave suspicion or on complaint, or in the case of foreign emigrant lodging-houses. The night visits are pretty nearly restricted to the low districts and tramp houses. The number of day visits paid during the year was 47,338, and the night visits 6,155. The number of lodging-houses found overcrowded on the night visits was 29, the number of informations laid for breaches of the bye-laws was 124, with the results of fines in 115 cases to the extent of £17 8s. 6d., in sums varying from 1s. to 10s. and costs. The number of lodging houses found dirty was 245; notices were served to lime-wash and cleanse.

It is necessary frequently to visit houses which are not licensed either as lodging or sub-let houses, especially when emigration is brisk, or at race times. There were 2,113 such visits paid during the day, and in 61 of the cases where suspicion was confirmed they were followed up by night visits. A tenant harbouring lodgers is not taken before the Justices for the first offence, but is noticed to have his rooms measured and licensed. There were 270 such notices issued during the year, but in only 9 cases did the tenants refuse to comply; they were brought before the Justices and fined. A bye-law requires that every case of infectious sickness in a lodging-house should be at once reported to the Medical Officer of Health. 44 cases of Fever and 26 cases of Small Pox occurred in lodging-houses; 63 of the patients were at once sent to Hospital, the bedding to the disinfecting apparatus, and the rooms purified and cleansed. The remaining 7 cases, being members of the keepers' families, were not removed, but the lodging-house licenses were at once suspended. No lodger died from Fever or Small Pox in a registered lodging-house, but there were 135 deaths from non-contagious diseases in lodging-houses, of which 89 belonged to the keepers' families, and 46 were lodgers.

SUB-LET HOUSES.

The number of sub-let houses on the Register at the termination of 1876 was 11,278; the number registered during 1877 was 763, making the total on the Register on the 31st December, 12,041. The number of visits paid during the night was 11,924, and during the day, 64,546, with the result of finding 1,740 rooms overcrowded. In addition to overcrowding the offence (though not punishable in sub-let houses) of permitting males and females not married to occupy the same room, comes under the notice, and is entered in the books of the Inspectors. There were 1,056 rooms thus indecently occupied by 1,535 males and 1,942 females, besides having also in these rooms 863 children between the ages of 5 and 13 years. The character of the indecent occupation may be judged of from the following facts:—In 536 instances one man and two women were found in the same bedroom; in 279 instances two men and one woman; in ninety-three instances two men and two women; in eighty instances one man and three women; in twenty-two instances three men and one woman; in twelve instances two men and three women; in ten instances one man and four women; in five instances four men and one woman; in four instances one man and five women; in four instances three men and two women; in three instances two men and four women; in two instances four men and three women; in one instance three men and three women; in one instance three men and four women; in one instance four men and two women; in one instance five men and one woman; in one instance six men and two women; and in one instance four men and four women.

Informations were laid against 1,382 chief tenants for permitting overcrowding in rooms, with the following results:—5 were fined 1s.; 1,151 fined 1s. and 1s. costs; 3 fined 2s. and 2s. costs; 180 fined 2s. 6d. and 2s. 6d. costs; 20 fined 5s. and 4s. 6d. costs; 9 fined 10s. and 4s. 6d. costs; and 1 fined 20s. and 4s. 6d. costs; making a total of fines levied during the year of £178 4s. Of the remaining 13 cases, 12 informations were withdrawn and 1 acquitted, the tenants having abated the overcrowding.

BAKEHOUSES.

1,136 day visits and 1,559 night visits have been made to Bakehouses during the year. 22 informations were laid for working young people, below the age of 18 years, between the hours of 9 p.m. and 5 a.m. Penalties were inflicted in each case, varying from 2s. 6d. and costs to 20s. and costs, and making a total of £8 10s. 6d. 154 Bakehouses were found dirty, and notices were served to limewash and cleanse them.

LICENSES FOR CATTLE.

During the year 1877, 13 applications for licenses to keep 95 cows were made to, and granted by the Health Committee; 23 shippsons licensed to keep 151 cows, have been given up during the year. There are at present 426 shippsons licensed to keep 4,562 cows. 52 of the shippsons previously licensed have been transferred to fresh tenants. In 60 of the shippsons pigs are also allowed to be kept; in 55 of them only 2 pigs each; in 3, 4 pigs; and in 2, 5 pigs.

47 applications were made during the year to keep pigs in styes separate from, and unconnected with shippsons; 11 of the applications for keeping 38 pigs were granted. 8 piggeries, licensed to keep 16 pigs, have been given up during the year. 11 piggeries previously licensed have been transferred to fresh tenants. The total number of premises or styes now licensed in the Borough (excluding shippsons) is 209, for keeping 619 pigs.

MORTUARIES.

During the year 103 bodies were, by order of the Justices on the certificate of the Medical Officer, removed to the Mortuaries provided by the Council under section 142 of the Public Health Act, 1875.

REMOVAL OF THE SICK TO HOSPITAL.

During the year there were removed to Hospital 569 persons, 255 of whom were suffering from Fever, and 314 from Small Pox. 198 were taken to Netherfield Road Hospital, 223 to the Parish Workhouse Hospital, 17 to Toxteth Workhouse Hospital, and 131 to West Derby Union Hospital.

DISINFECTION OF HOUSES.

In all cases of infectious disease the houses were disinfected, free of cost, with sulphurous gas, by officers appointed by the Health Committee; but whenever there was sickness in any room of the house, so as to endanger health by the use of sulphurous gas, carbolic acid powder was freely sprinkled in the rooms and passages of the house until the sulphurous gas could be used safely. No house is considered properly disinfected until sulphurous gas has been used. The existence of sickness, and the consequent employment of carbolic acid powder, necessitate many visits by the persons in charge of disinfection. There were in all 5,717 visits paid during the year to houses for the purpose of disinfection, the number of houses properly disinfected being 3,180.

THE DISINFECTING APPARATUS.

The number of articles sent to the Disinfecting Apparatus during the year amounted to 58,365.

The following Report has been kindly prepared by J. Campbell Brown, D. Sc. Analyst for the Borough :—

REPORT ON THE WORK DONE IN THE BOROUGH OF LIVERPOOL DURING THE YEAR 1877, UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF "THE SALE OF FOOD AND DRUGS ACT, 1875."

During the year 1877 the Public Analyst for the Borough of Liverpool has analysed 261 samples, of which 243 were submitted by the Inspector of Nuisances for the Borough, 4 by other public officers, and 14 by private persons.

The number of prosecutions instituted was 63, the results being that 7 cases were dismissed, cautioned, or withdrawn on the understanding that the sale of the objectionable article would be stopped; and in 56 cases fines were inflicted, varying from 1s. to 60s., besides costs in each case.

The total amount of fines was £44 12s., and £27 17s. 6d. costs, including those inflicted in private prosecutions.

The average amount of penalty was only about 15s. 11d.; the average amount of penalty inflicted in the County of Lancaster for similar offences having been £2 17s. 4d., or three and a-half times as great.

LIVERPOOL WATER SUPPLY.

By permission of the Water Committee, the following Summary of the Analyses of the Water supplied to Liverpool, during the year 1877, has been kindly supplied by Dr. J. Campbell Brown :—

During the year 1877, periodical analyses of eighty-four samples of water have been made on behalf of the Water Committee, besides occasional analyses of special samples.

There has been very little variation in the composition of the water from the several sources of public supply, except in the case of the Green Lane Well.

The average composition of the water is shown very nearly in the accompanying table.

Bootle Well yields wholesome water for drinking purposes, but very hard, and therefore wasteful for washing, and unsuitable for manufacturing purposes.

Dudlow Lane Well has now recovered a fair degree of purity, and yields soft wholesome water.

Windsor Well yields hard but wholesome water: its hardness is gradually increasing, but when the pumping is partly stopped, the hardness falls as the water rises to a higher level in the well.

Green Lane Well yields sufficiently pure water, but its hardness is gradually increasing. By the stoppage or limitation of the pumping a marked change is produced in the composition of the water; with only a trifling increase in the organic impurities there is a great reduction in the amount of nitrates. These nitrates are produced by the oxidation of sewage matter during the percolation of surface water through the rock. The water also becomes comparatively soft, and similar to Dudlow Lane Well water.

Kensington Reservoir has generally been filled with a mixture of Green Lane and Rivington water; but lately its composition has shown that it has contained almost exclusively Rivington water.
