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

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
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REPORT, 1879.

THE returns made to the Registrar General for the year 1879 comprised a period of fifty-three weeks, and included 21,277 births and 14,818 deaths, giving a natural increase of 6,459. The Birth-rate was 39·5, and the Death-rate 27·5, per 1,000.

The estimated population for this year was 538,338, and for 1880, 544,056, giving an estimated increase of 5,718, or 741 less than the natural increase. To render the following tables comparable with the corresponding tables in previous reports, they have been calculated for fifty-two weeks, unless otherwise stated, and give a Birth-rate of 38·7, and a Death-rate of 26·9, per 1,000.

The year was remarkable for the low temperature which prevailed, more particularly in the first quarter, when it was lower than in any corresponding period for the last twenty years, and was, consequently, marked by a great increase in deaths from lung diseases. The cold and stormy summer had a beneficial effect in lessening the number of deaths from Diarrhoea, which were fewer than ever recorded in Liverpool.

In a great community like ours there will always be a large amount of animal and vegetable matter undergoing decomposition, and the atmosphere will contain various noxious effluvia; it will, therefore, be readily understood how the past summer was so healthy when we consider how putrefaction was retarded by the cold, the atmosphere washed of its impurities, and the streets and drains cleansed by the rain, and the perflation of the courts and narrow streets promoted by the high winds.

ZYMOTICS.

This is a class of diseases over which sanitary measures have the greatest control, and the results obtained by the exertions of the Corporation to remove the stigma under which the town laboured are very satisfactory, and will become each year more evident, as sanitary measures are only gradual in their beneficial operation. Typhus, from which the town has suffered so much, continues to decline, and it may confidently be hoped that it will shortly become a disease of comparatively rare occurrence. In the following table of deaths from fever 91 only were registered as typhus, and the deaths from other forms of fever also show a corresponding decrease :—

SCARLATINA was prevalent during the year, and occasioned 734 deaths, being 16 more than the average of the last ten years. Isolation of the patient is the only means of preventing the spread of this disease, and, as there are very few houses in which it can be effectually adopted, it is desirable that the patients should be removed to hospital, where they will be placed under better sanitary conditions than can be obtained in most houses, and, consequently, have better prospects of recovery. Beyond this advantage it will also do away with the risk of contagion being carried from the house and spread by children attending schools, servants and others visiting friends, places of business, &c. In too many instances has the non-removal of the first case

caused the loss of two or three children in the same family, and very frequently the mothers have also been sacrificed, for the Scarlatina poison is particularly fatal to women in child-bed.

MEASLES was more fatal than usual, owing to the complications arising from the cold in the last quarter of the year, when 321 deaths from this disease occurred out of 445 for the whole year.

When a case of infectious disease is reported, the house is visited and every information and assistance given for the removal of the patient, if desired, and disinfection of the clothing, house, &c. The number of infectious cases reported during the year was 3,857, and 710 patients were removed to hospital, of whom 244 were removed by the Sanitary Officers.

1,855 post cards were sent to the head masters of the various schools informing them that children from infected houses attended their schools; similar information was also given to the School Board.

CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

This Act was referred to the Medical Officer to carry out in conjunction with the Veterinary Surgeon, the Inspector of Nuisances, and the Meat Inspectors. From October 1st, 1878, to December 31st, 1879, Pleuropneumonia was found in 11 cowsheds, affecting 34 cows, which were slaughtered by order of the owners or of the Corporation; and 43 cows, which were not diseased, but had been either in contact with the affected ones or in the same cowsheds, were slaughtered by order of the owners.

Pig Typhoid was found amongst the swine imported from Ireland and America. The disease was detected in 30 Irish pigs and 2 American.

The Dairies, Cowsheds, and Milkshops Order, made under the above Act, authorised the Corporation to make regulations for prescribing and regulating the cleansing of dairies and cowsheds in the occupation of persons following the trade of cowkeepers or dairymen, and the cleansing of milk stores, milk shops, and milk vessels used for containing milk for sale by such persons. The following regulations were made by the Council at a meeting held on the 5th day of March, 1879; and the registration of cow-keepers and dairy-men has been effected, subject to the approval of the Council, in this department.

Under the Local Improvement Act, 1867, Cowsheds and Lairs for Cattle were licensed, and the same is still enforced. For the number licensed see page 48.

REGULATIONS.

- 1.—That any room used for the storage or sale of milk shall not be occupied as a living room nor communicate by door, window, or otherwise with any bedroom.
- 2.—That the milk vessels, tables, benches, and all other utensils and furniture shall be washed and thoroughly cleansed every day.
- 3.—That the floor of every room used for the storage or sale of milk shall be washed and cleansed every day before nine o'clock in the morning, and that the walls and ceiling shall be limewashed twice every year, that is to say, in March and October; but if the walls are painted, then they shall be washed and thoroughly cleansed twice every year, in March and October.
- 4.—That the words " Registered for the Sale of Milk " be painted over the entrance door of every room used for the sale of milk.
- 5.—All premises used for the sale of milk shall be open at all times to the inspection and examination of the officers appointed by the Local Authority for the purpose.
- 6.—The floors of all Cow Sheds must be of brick, stone, or other non-absorbent material, and sewered.
- 7.—The walls must be limewashed once yearly, that is to say, in March.
- 8.—There shall be a superficial space for each cow of not less than $3\frac{1}{2}$ feet by 7 feet, but if two cows are kept together, then the space may be 6 feet by 7 feet. The passage of the Cow Shed shall, for each cow, be of the width of 3 feet, but if the cows are arranged as in a double Cow Shed, then the partition passage may be 4 feet wide.
- 9.—The floors of all Cow Sheds must be cleansed daily.
- 10.—The manure heap of the Cow Shed must be kept in a "sewered middenstead" and removed once during every fortnight.

CANAL BOATS ACT, 1877.

THE regulations made by the Local Government Board under the above Act with reference to Canal Boats used as dwellings, state that every owner of a Canal Boat, who may desire to register it as a dwelling, shall apply to the Registration Authority having a district abutting on the canal on which the boat is accustomed or intended to ply. The Corporation of Liverpool is the authority for that portion of the Leeds and Liverpool Canal which is within their district, and it is incumbent on them not to allow any boats to be used for dwellings unless registered. Previous to the registration of a boat it must be examined as to its condition, the cabins measured, and the cubical space ascertained, and proper means for ventilation adopted. The Medical Officer is greatly indebted to Mr. Lee, the Manager for the Canal Company, for much valuable advice and assistance. The system of ventilation prescribed

was, for the after cabins] a small raised skylight with louvre openings at the sides, and, at the sides or stern part of the cabin, perforated ventilators with slides to regulate the draught according to the weather; for the fore cabins the covering of the hatchway was raised four inches, and perforations made in that side of the cover looking towards the afterpart of the boat. Deck ventilators could not be applied to the fore cabins, as the decks are liable to be flooded with water in passing the locks. Many boats plying on the Canal bring coal from the Wigan district, and take back manure or other offensive cargoes; they have all been fitted up with double bulkheads, &c., according to the Act. There are no "narrow" boats on the Canal.

83 Boats occasionally used as "fly" boats; when so used are allowed 174 persons in both cabins. When not used as "fly" boats they are allowed 102 in the after cabins and 95 in the fore cabins.

6 Boats only used as "fly" boats are allowed 24.

165 Boats have only the after cabins registered; 4 are allowed 3 persons each; 158 allowed 4 persons each; and 3 allowed 5 persons each.

28 Boats have both cabins registered; 4 are allowed 3 in the after cabin and 2 in fore cabin; 24 are allowed 4 in after cabin and 2 in fore cabin.

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OFFENSIVE TRADES.

Seventeen applications were made during the year for permission to carry on the trades of Fat-melting, Tripe-boiling, Soap-making, &c., &c., but eleven only were granted, the premises in the other cases not being suitable for the purpose.

Three certificates were given under the 114th section of the Public Health Act, 1875, stating that effluvia injurious to health were given off in the processes of reburning animal charcoal, used in the preparation of glucose; gut dressing, and the melting of fat scrapings; and the kiln drying of damaged cotton.

The Magistrates found the complaints proved, and directed in the first and second cases that means were to be adopted for the prevention and abatement of the nuisances to the satisfaction of the Medical Officer, and in the third case the defendant undertook to discontinue the business.

During the fifty-two weeks of the year 1879 (terminating on Saturday, December 27), the Returns of the Local Registrars record 20,844 births and 14,502 deaths within the Borough; the numbers for the corresponding period of the previous year, 1878, were 20,612 births and 15,584 deaths.

Of the births 10,571 were males and 10,273 were females, making the total Birth-rate of the Borough equal to 38·7 per 1,000; the average of the previous ten years being 38·0 per 1,000.

DEATHS.

Of the 14,502 deaths 7,415 were of males, and 7,087 of females; 6,846 occurred in the Parish, and 7,656 in the Out-townships.

The Death-rate of the Borough was equal to 26·9 per 1,000. The average of the previous ten years was 29·1 per 1,000.

The following table shows the actual number of deaths registered in the Parish and Out-townships, previous to the transference to the districts from whence the patients were removed, of the deaths occurring in the Workhouses and Hospitals. The Death-rate of the Parish was equal to 31.8, and that of the Out-townships to 21.9, per 1,000 of the population.

From the returns made as to the residences of persons dying in the Workhouses and Hospitals of the town, we are able to classify 1,813 of the deaths in these establishments under the wards and districts from whence the patients were removed, viz., 398 under Scotland Ward, 153 under Vauxhall Ward, 166 under St. Paul's and Exchange Wards (Dale Street District), 302 under St. Anne's and Lime Street Wards (Islington District), 30 under Castle Street and St. Peter's Wards (St. George's District), 116 under Pitt Street and Great George's Wards (St. Thomas's District), 173 under Rodney Street and Abercromby Wards (Mount Pleasant District), 210 under the Out-towmship of Everton, 65 under that of Kirkdale, 92 under that of West Derby, and 108 under those of the Toxteths. This will leave unclassified 277 deaths of persons whose previous residences were either unknown or not specified;

and these, in the absence of definite information, have been placed in the Wards in proportion to the number of total deaths; and 176 who were residents outside the Borough.

The results of the alterations occasioned by this re-arrangement of the deaths in the wards and districts will be shown in the following table, from which a calculated rate of mortality per 1,000 of the estimated inhabitants has been made; but it must be observed that the estimate of the population of all the districts in the Parish has been made on a rate of decrease which is probably in excess of what is going on.

The deaths of Infants below the fifth year of their age amounted to 6,346, and thus comprised 43·8 per cent. of the whole deaths; the average number for the preceding ten years was 7,118, and the average percentage 47·6. The deaths of Infants below one year of age amounted to 3,384, or 16·4 per cent. of all the children born within the Borough died before attaining the age of twelve months.

The first of the following tables shows the districts where Infantile Mortality was relatively and absolutely greatest, the second table illustrates the influence of age on the death-rate of the Borough, and the third table places, in one connected view, the pathological history of the death registry.

ZYMOTICS.

This class of diseases occasioned 2,491 deaths during the year 1879, and accounted for 17·2 per cent. of the total mortality within the Borough during the same period. The average number of deaths from these diseases for the preceding ten years was 3,827, and the percentage death rate for 1879 was 8·0 per cent. less than the proportional rate of zymotic deaths to deaths from all causes during the preceding decennial period. The following table shows the localities and the periods of their fatal prevalence :—

FEVER.

Fever accounted for 248 deaths within the Borough of Liverpool, or for 118 in the Parish and 130 in the Out-Townships. (The average number of deaths for the preceding ten years was 493). The rate of its mortality was equal to 0·5 per 1,000 of the estimated population. Its percentage rate relatively to deaths from all causes was 1·7 during the first, 1·8 during the second, 1·9 during the third, and 1·4 during the fourth quarter of the year. Its annual rate relatively to deaths from all causes

was 1·7 per cent., and relatively to deaths from zymotic causes 10·0 per cent. Its deaths included 133 males and 115 females; 86 persons below the age of 15, 49 between the ages of 15 and 30, and 113 above the age of 30.

Under the term Fever every form of continued fever is included; but the registers of deaths attribute 16 cases to gastric fever, 82 to typhoid fever, 31 to enteric fever, 13 to continued fever, 2 to relapsing fever, 91 to typhus, 15 to fever, 3 to febris, and under that of febricula 5 deaths.

The following tables are in themselves sufficiently explanatory. The first compares the averages of deaths from typhus during the preceding ten years with those during 1879; the second and third tables show the districts of the town and the periods of the year in which all forms of continued fever were most fatally prevalent; the fourth marks in streets the habitats of the disease; and the remaining tables the occupations and positions of its victims.

from all causes was 4·5 per cent. in the first quarter, 4·5 in the second, 5·0 in the third, and 6·1 in the fourth quarter of the year; its annual rate relatively to all deaths was 5·1 per cent., and relatively to deaths from zymotic causes 29·5 per cent.

TUBERCULAR DISEASES.

This group of diseases includes Phthisis, Scrofula, Tabes Mesenterica, and Hydrocephalus. They occasioned 1,856 deaths in the Borough of Liverpool during the year 1879, of which 819 occurred in the Parish, and 1,037 in the Out-Townships. (The average number of deaths for the preceding ten years was 2,028). The death-rate was 3·4 per 1,000 of the estimated population; their percentage death-rate relatively to deaths from all causes was 12·8.

PHTHISIS.

The deaths from Phthisis amounted to 1,348, and show a gradual decrease, the average number for the preceding ten years being 1,568.

The Select Vestry are kind enough to forward to the Office a daily list of the cases of Fever and Small Pox attended by the Parochial Medical Officers, and a monthly list of the cases of all Zymotic diseases, of Tubercular diseases, and of sickness from other causes, which have occurred in the twelve districts of the Parish.

The daily list enables the Health Committee to take action for the purification of the houses, and I am able from the other to classify the districts and streets in which sickness has prevailed.

These show that the average number of persons suffering from Continued Fever (including therein Typhus, Typhoid, and simple Continued Fever) at one time in Hospital during the year 1879 was 28, and their percentage Death-rate was 13·5. The average number of cases of Measles at one time in Hospital during the year was 3, and the percentage Death-rate was 6·6; the average number of cases of Scarlatina at one time in the Hospital during the year was 11, and the percentage Death-rate was 25·3.

The number of persons in receipt of Parochial Relief on Saturday, 28th of June, 1879, was 5,930, or 470 more than at the corresponding period of 1878; and the number on Saturday, the 27th December, 1879, was 6,730, or 195 more than at the same period of 1878.

LODGING-HOUSES.

The Health Committee have, since the passing of the Sanitary Act, 1866, ruled that, as far as possible, all registered lodging-houses should have a day apartment for the accommodation of their lodgers, and that all houses where single rooms were occupied by day and night should be registered as sub-let. The space required for a night lodger in a registered lodging-house is 300 cubical feet, while the space in a sub-let house for each adult is 350 feet.

There were on the register 1,095 lodging-houses at the end of 1878, and 1,064 at the end of 1879. This difference was occasioned by the removal of 301 old licenses, and the addition of 270 new ones. The visits to lodging-houses are both by day and night. The lodging-houses of the better class, and especially those provided only with single beds for each person, and only with the number of beds equivalent to the number of lodgers allowed, are not visited at night except on grave suspicion or on complaint, or in the case of foreign emigrant lodging-houses. The night visits are pretty nearly restricted to the low districts and tramp houses. The number of day visits paid during the year was 45,329, and the night visits 5,970. The number of lodging-houses found overcrowded on the night visits was 32, the number of informations laid for breaches of the bye-laws was 122, with the results of fines in 116 cases to the extent of £21 16s. 6d., in sums varying from 1s. to 20s. and costs. The number of lodging houses found dirty was 209; notices were served to lime-wash and cleanse.

It is necessary frequently to visit houses which are not licensed either as lodging or sub-let houses, especially when emigration is brisk, or at race times. There were 3,114 such visits paid during the day, and in 97 of the cases where suspicion was confirmed they were followed up by night visits. A tenant harbouring lodgers is not taken before the Justices for the first offence, but is noticed to apply to have his rooms measured and licensed. There were 214 such notices issued during the year, but in only 12 cases did the tenants refuse to comply; they were brought before the Justices and fined. A bye-law requires that every case of infectious sickness in a lodging-house should be at once reported to the Medical Officer of Health. 25 cases of fever and 4 cases of small pox occurred in lodging-houses; in 28 of the cases the patients were at once sent to hospital, the remaining one being a member of the keeper's family, was not removed; this latter patient died. In all cases of fever or infectious disease the bedding was at once removed to the disinfecting apparatus, and the rooms purified and cleansed; in the case where the patient remained, the license to receive lodgers was suspended by the Medical Officer. No

lodger died from fever or small pox in a registered lodging-house ; but, not including the case of fever, there were 125 deaths from non-contagious diseases in lodging-houses, of which 79 belonged to the keepers' families and 46 were lodgers.

SUB-LET HOUSES.

The number of sub-let Houses on the Register at the termination of 1878 was 12,294 ; the number registered during 1879 was 850, making the total on the Register on the 31st December, 13,144. The number of visits paid during the night was 12,825, and during the day 70,676, with the result of finding 1,761 rooms overcrowded. In addition to overcrowding, the offence (though not punishable in sub-let houses) of permitting males and females not married to occupy the same room comes under the notice, and is entered in the books of the Inspectors. There were 1,017 rooms thus indecently occupied by 1,500 males and 1,982 females, besides having also in these rooms 781 children between the ages of 5 and 13 years. The character of the indecent occupation may be judged of from the following facts :—In 439 instances one man and two women were found in the same bedroom ; in 237 instances two men and one woman ; in 153 instances one man and three women ; in 105 instances two men and two women ; in thirty-three instances three men and one woman ; in fourteen instances two men and three women ; in ten instances one man and four women ; in four instances two men and four women ; in three instances three men and two women ; in three instances three men and three women ; in three instances three men and four women ; in two instances four men and one woman ; in two instances four men and four women ; in two instances five men and one woman ; in one instance one man and six women ; in one instance two men and five women ; in one instance three men and five women ; in one instance four men and two women ; in one instance four men and three women ; in one instance five men and five women ; and in one instance seven men and two women.

Informations were laid against 1,403 chief tenants for permitting overcrowding in rooms, with the following results :—1 was fined 1s ; 1,149 fined 1s. and 1s. costs ; 4 fined 2s. and 1s. costs ; 181 fined 2s. 6d. and 2s. 6d. costs ; 37 fined 5s. and 4s. 6d. costs ; and 7 fined 10s. and 4s. 6d. costs ; making a total of fines levied during the year of £183 9s. Of the remaining 24 cases, 14 informations were withdrawn and 10 acquitted, the tenants having abated the overcrowding.

LICENSES FOR CATTLE.

During the year 1879, 46 applications for licenses to keep 538 cows were made to, and granted by the Health Committee. There are at present 452 shippsons licensed to keep 5,235 cows. 110 of the shippsons previously licensed have been transferred to fresh tenants.

31 applications were made during the year to keep pigs in styes separate from, and unconnected with shippsons; 6 of the applications for keeping 12 pigs were granted. 7 piggeries, licensed to keep 31 pigs, have been given up during the year. 4 piggeries previously licensed have been transferred to fresh tenants. The total number of premises or styes now licensed in the Borough is 164, for keeping 493 pigs.

MORTUARIES.

During the year 66 bodies were, by order of the Justices on the certificate of the Medical Officer, removed to the Mortuaries provided by the Council under section 142 of the Public Health Act, 1875.

Of the patients removed to Hospital the following were conveyed by the Sanitary Officers:—232 cases of Fever and Scarlatina, 4 cases of Small Pox, 7 cases of Measles, and 1 case of Diphtheria, making a total of 244 persons. 38 were taken to Netherfield Road Hospital, 159 to the Parish Workhouse Hospital, 2 to Toxteth Workhouse Hospital, and 45 to West Derby Union Hospital.

DISINFECTION OF HOUSES.

In all cases of infectious disease the houses were disinfected, free of cost, with sulphurous gas, by officers appointed by the Health Committee; but whenever there was sickness in any room of the house, so as to endanger health by the use of sulphurous gas, carbolic acid powder was freely sprinkled in the rooms and passages of the house until the sulphurous gas could be used safely. No house is considered properly disinfected until sulphurous gas has been used. The existence of sickness, and the consequent employment of carbolic acid powder, necessitate many visits by the persons in charge of disinfection. There were in all 5,410 visits paid during the year to houses for the purpose of disinfection, the number of houses properly disinfected being 2,170.

THE DISINFECTING APPARATUS.

The number of articles sent to the Disinfecting Apparatus during the year amounted to 35,054.

LIVERPOOL WATER SUPPLY.

By permission of the Water Committee, the following Summary of the Analyses of the Water supplied to Liverpool, during the year 1879, has been kindly supplied by Dr. J. Campbell Brown :—

During the year 1879, the several sources of water supply have been in a satisfactory condition. The average composition of the water is shown in the accompanying table.

When the pumps ceased working in any well, either for repairs or for other reasons, the proportions of dissolved matters, and especially of hardening salts, are very much decreased, but the freedom from organic contamination does not always decrease in like manner.

The Bootle new deep bore has been finished during the year, and probably a number of analyses will be made during the next year. At present the water has not been sufficiently examined to enable me to say more than that, compared with the old-well water, the water pumped from the new bore contains less mineral matter and hardening salts, but contains a considerably higher proportion of chlorides, and is almost absolutely free from organic matter and from oxydised or previous sewage contamination.

APPENDIX.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD RETURNS.

THE Returns of Sickness required by the Local Government Board would be very valuable for statistical purposes, even if such returns could only be approximately correct; but in a district like that of the Liverpool Sanitary Authority, having a large moving population, and comprising one entire parochial area and a portion of two others, with hospital accommodation not confined to the Borough, but greatly used by people whose homes are outside the Borough, any attempt to draw useful or reliable deductions from such returns as could be obtained would be futile. To make such returns of value to a Medical Officer of Health it would be necessary to give the street or precise locality in which the patient dwelt. It would not be sufficient to give the parochial area alone, for such information would not enable him to ascertain the local causes operating adversely to health, but would assume that the same causes of disease were equally spread over the whole district. The great difference between Abercromby and Vauxhall Wards, or between Rodney Street and Scotland Wards, is illustrated by the difference in the inhabitants, the character of their employment, their dwellings, and the presence or absence of manufactories and offensive trades, and is reflected in the disparity of the death rate. To record the sickness of every seaman, emigrant, or visitor would be impossible; to follow out the history of out-pauper patients would be impracticable, for the chronic cases frequently change their residence and pass from under the care of one doctor to another, whilst the acute cases, if not sent to hospital, generally fall under the care of the dispensaries. To furnish returns of patients in hospitals is possible and might be correctly made, but would require great labour and attention. From the large number of patients admitted and the conditions under which they are received it is very possible that in many cases the first diagnosis will not be the true one, and to re-enter the case would be to record two patients instead of one, and if not altered and the patient died the rate of mortality of such disease would appear greater than was the fact. Some idea of the difficulties can be imagined when the population of the Parish of Liverpool, 205,338, is considered, and that between twenty and thirty thousand sick persons pass yearly through the Parish Hospital in Brownlow Hill. Patients are sent to this hospital by the Parish District Doctors, by the Dispensaries and other Medical Charities, by the Police, the Health Committee, &c., and some are admitted on their own application. There is also the Mill Road Hospital of the West Derby Union,

which contains not only the sick paupers of Everton (population 128,477), Kirkdale (population 55,371), and West Derby Wards (population 61,832) in the Borough, but those from Bootle, Walton, West Derby, &c., outside the Borough. During the epidemic of smallpox in 1876-7, by an arrangement between the Select Vestry and the West Derby Guardians all cases of that disease were taken to Mill Road and all fever cases to Brownlow Hill. And there is the Toxteth Workhouse Hospital outside the Borough, which accommodates the sick paupers from the Toxteth Wards (population 87,320) within the Borough.

On the admission into the above establishments of patients suffering from infectious diseases notice is sent to the Medical Officer of Health, giving the residences from which they have been removed and stating the nature of the illness.

Liverpool is well supplied with Medical Charitable Institutions; and the following table, showing the number of cases treated during the year 1878, is somewhat startling, for 188,416 cases treated gratuitously, besides pauper cases, in one year is far beyond anything that could be expected in any English city or town, and can only be accounted for by many people attending first at one institution and then another, and thus being enumerated over and over again.
