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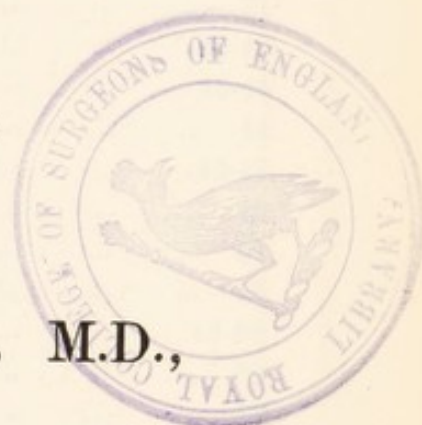

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CENSUS, 1881.

THE Superintendent Registrars have kindly furnished returns of the Census taken on the night of April 3rd, 1881, which are exclusive of returns sent direct to the Registrar-General. The increase of the population in the decade is 55,244, raising the total population within the Municipality to 548,649. If to this be added the increase of three months (which will give the number used in calculating the death rate), the population at the middle of the year will be 550,110, whilst the estimated population was 549,834. Inhabited houses have increased 13,896 since the Census of 1871, and the average number of persons per house is 5·9 against 6·3 in 1871, and 6·7 in 1861. The increase of population and houses has taken place in the Out Townships, the Parish or Old Borough having decreased from 238,411 to 207,132, and inhabited houses from 34,293 to 31,678. The number of dwelling-houses erected during the ten years has been 18,653, and pulled down 2,927, giving an increase of dwellings of 15,736. Uninhabited houses have increased from 8,532 in 1871 to 10,381; and there are also many houses, which are now used only for business purposes, of which there are no record.

The number of deaths in the ten years—1871 to 1880—was 147,605; whilst in the ten previous years—1861 to 1870—there were 156,205, being a decrease of 8,600 deaths, notwithstanding the increase of population, reducing the death rate from the previous decade 33· per 1000 persons living to 28·5 per 1000 for the present. This decrease has been progressive, and is satisfactory evidence of the improved health of the people. The death-rate for the five years—1871 to 1875—was 29·5, and from 1876 to 1880, 27·5. The appended table shows a very satisfactory decrease in the number of deaths from zymotic diseases, and of children under five years of age.

The epidemic periods during the decade have been the year 1871, when smallpox of a virulent type prevailed, following the introduction of the disease by Spanish sailors, when 1,919 persons died; 1874, scarlatina caused 1911 deaths; 1876, smallpox caused this year 386 deaths, and the following year, 1877, 299 deaths; and during the year 1878 scarlatina and measles were general, the former causing 947, and the latter 444 deaths.

REPORT, 1880.

THE returns furnished by the Registrars of Births and Deaths for the fifty-two weeks of the year 1880 included 20,783 births and 14,811 deaths, giving a natural increase of 5,972 to the population, being 194 more than the estimated increase between the years 1880 and 1881.

The growth of large towns arises from two causes—the natural increase and immigration, of which we have no returns; and as this is the tenth year since the census of 1871, the estimated population, 544,056, can only be considered approximate, and when the estimated increase or decrease in divisions or wards of the City are calculated the numbers estimated will be liable to errors.

The meteorological conditions of the early months of the year were favourable to health, the temperature being above the average. In the first quarter the number of deaths was 3,619, and in the corresponding quarter of 1879, when the temperature was below the average, there were 4,413 deaths, chiefly from pulmonary disease; in the second quarter there were 3,530 deaths against 3,163 in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. The greatly increased temperature of the third quarter caused a large mortality amongst infants and the total number of deaths registered was 4,091, whilst in the same quarter of the previous year, when the temperature was very low, the number of deaths was 2,875, or 1,216 fewer. The daily meteorology of these months, and the number of deaths from diarrhœa are fully set out in the report. The Local Government Board, having been impressed with the great increase of deaths from diarrhœa in the large towns, communicated with the Health Committee, and the Medical Officer submitted the following report on

SUMMER DIARRHŒA IN 1880.

Epidemic or summer diarrhœa is classed as a zymotic disease, and is notably a disease of towns, chiefly affecting children, more particularly infants under one year of age. It has been very prevalent during the third quarter of this year, though its periods of greatest mortality have varied very considerably in different towns, arising no doubt from the difference in the local meteorological conditions. The disease attained its maximum mortality in Brighton as early as the week terminating July 21st, in London and Portsmouth, August 7th, Liverpool, September 11th, and the latest in Bristol, September 25th.

The annual death-rate per one thousand of the population, during the three months, varied from 2·4 in Bristol to 6· in Liverpool, 6·1 in Birmingham and Leeds, 6·5 in Sheffield, 6·8 in Norwich, 8· in Hull, 8·8 in Salford, and 10·6 in Leicester.

The number of deaths in Liverpool was 813, of which 462 were under one year of age, 317 above one and under five, and 34 above five years. The greatest percentage of deaths of children under one year of age, relatively to the number of registered births, was in Vauxhall ward 15·4, whilst in Scotland Ward it was 13·, Kirkdale 11·8, and the lowest, 6·4, in West Derby Ward. The accompanying table shows the number of deaths in each ward during each of the thirteen weeks, and the map shows the localities of the deaths.

In endeavouring to ascertain the cause of the increase of the disease over the corresponding period of last year, it may be confidently stated that, so far as the action of the Health Committee was concerned, the City was in as favourable a state to contend against disease as in the previous year, but the meteorological conditions were entirely different. In the Medical Officer's report for 1879, it is remarked "that the cold and stormy summer had a beneficial effect in lessening the number of deaths from diarrhœa, which were fewer than ever recorded in Liverpool," and a table is appended comparing the high temperature of 1878, when 800 deaths occurred, and the low temperature of 1879, when there were only 216 deaths. The effect of a high temperature is also illustrated by the table, attached to this report, which shows that, during the first week in July, terminating on the 10th with a temperature of 57·9, there were 16 deaths; as the temperature rose so did the number of deaths increase, until the week terminating September 4th, when the average mean temperature was 66·1 and the number of deaths 109; though the mean temperature of the following week fell to 60·3, the number of deaths rose to 112, the fatal effect of the great heat of the previous week being then felt.

Heat by itself will not produce diarrhœa, but acting upon organic matter it promotes decomposition, filling the atmosphere with noxious emanations, which, with the exhalations from a crowded population, envelopes as in a fog the ill-ventilated parts of the City. Whether any specific organisms are produced or their growth and productiveness fostered under the influence of a high temperature has not been decided, but neither heat nor dirt alone will produce diarrhœa, but, combined, the result is certain.

An important element to be considered, where there is a high infantile mortality, is the birth-rate, which supplies the material most favourable for disease. In the year 1879 only four of the large towns had a higher birth-rate than Liverpool, and three of them—Hull, Birmingham, and Salford—had this year a higher death-rate from diarrhœa. During the third quarter of this year the birth-rate in Liverpool was higher than in any of the large towns, but the above-named towns, with Sheffield, Norwich, Leeds, and Leicester, had a higher proportional mortality.

Though the disease was general over the whole City, yet, on reference to the map, the greatest mortality will be found in those districts where the houses are most crowded together and the population most dense. The consequence of those insanitary conditions is reflected in the general high rate of infantile mortality which prevails in these localities, and it can be no matter of surprise that, when diarrhœa prevails, the enfeebled constitutions and lowered vitality of the children render them unable to cope with the disease, and they sink into early graves.

The system of sub-letting houses greatly aggravates the evil, and is causing districts once comparatively healthy to be now the constant homes of disease, and the Medical Officer regrets to state that this practice is extending and deteriorating the physical and moral condition of the people. The cause, no doubt, in the first instance, arose from poverty, but it has now become a general custom, and is in too many cases the origin as well as the consequence of improvidence.

The neglect and indifference with which children are treated in some of these houses is painful to witness, and that large numbers of them die can excite no surprise, for the wonder is that any of them survive.

The following table shows the localities of the deaths from Diarrhoea during the third quarter, and on the map are marked the localities of the deaths during the whole year:—

The above table illustrates the effect of temperature in this and the previous two years, showing the variation of date of maximum death-rate to be concurrent with the greatest heat.

FEVER.

There was a slight increase of deaths from fever registered during the year. 141 deaths were returned as typhoid, gastric, and enteric fever, whilst in the previous year the deaths from the same causes were 129. Typhus caused 87 deaths, being 4 less than in the previous year, the remaining death returns being from fever, continued fever, and febricula.

Two deaths occurred from SMALL POX—one was a girl admitted an inmate of a servants' home, the other was a gentleman who had arrived only a few days previously from London, and in whom the disease was latent. Both cases were removed to hospital.

The deaths from SCARLATINA and MEASLES were below the average, and fewer than in 1879.

When a case of infectious disease is reported, the house is visited and every information and assistance given for the removal of the patient, if desired, and disinfection of the clothing, house, &c. The number of infectious cases reported during the year was 2,786, and 904 patients were removed to hospital, of whom 369 were removed by the Sanitary Officers.

1,463 post cards were sent to the head masters of the various schools informing them that children from infected houses attended their schools; similar information was also given to the School Board.

HOSPITAL ACCOMMODATION FOR INFECTIOUS DISEASE.

For the accommodation and treatment of infectious disease the Select Vestry have a hospital in Brownlow Hill, the West Derby Guardians one in Mill Road, Everton, and the Toxteth Guardians have theirs in Smithdown Road. Patients are admitted into these institutions free of charge. There is also another institution for infectious disease situated in Netherfield Road, supported by voluntary subscriptions and payment by patients, the charges being from 10s. 6d. to £2 2s. per week, according to accommodation. The Corporation contributed £5,000 towards its erection; and owing to the diminishing number of fever cases the funds of the institution were so reduced that further application was made for assistance. In order to extend its usefulness and offer an inducement to the public to avail themselves of its advantages, the Corporation have undertaken to pay an annual sum of £250, provided 25 beds were placed at the disposal of the Medical Officer of Health at the reduced charge of 7s. per week, payable by each patient.

The importance of early isolation of cases of infectious disease cannot be too strongly urged upon the attention of the public as the most effectual measure for limiting the spread of contagion, and the small charge now made will enable many persons to avail themselves of private hospital treatment who hitherto objected to entering parish hospitals. The Medical Officer will be glad to grant certificates of admission for proper cases on application at his office.

OFFENSIVE TRADES.

The number of applications for permission to carry on the different businesses which come under the designation of offensive trades was thirteen, three of which were granted. In every instance the premises were visited and inquiries made as to the proposed method of conducting the processes of manufacture. A business was established without the consent of the Corporation for the preparation of albumen from the serum of blood and the manufacture of manure from blood clots and sulphuric acid; proceedings were commenced against the proprietor, and stayed on condition that a license was applied for to manufacture albumen and an undertaking given that serum only should be brought into the City, and the making of manure given up.

INSANITARY DWELLINGS.

Pursuant to the Liverpool Sanitary Amendment Act, the Medical Officer of Health made a presentment to the Grand Jury at the Quarter Sessions held in August that eighty-nine houses were unfit for human habitation, or in a condition, state, or situation prejudicial to health, and stating that the defects could be remedied by certain structural alterations and improvements, and by the demolition of certain premises, the nature of which was fully set out in each case. The Grand Jury, some of its members having visited the different properties, approved of the presentment, and it is now being carried out by the Corporation.

BRICK BURNING.

A common kiln for the purpose of brick burning having been erected on a piece of vacant land in Lightbody Street, the effluvia from which were complained of by the inhabitants in the neighbourhood as a nuisance, proceedings were taken on the certificate of the Medical Officer, and a conviction obtained.

For the other sanitary work reference is made to the tables.

During the fifty-two weeks of the year 1880 (terminating on Saturday, January 1, 1881), the Returns of the Local Registrars record 20,783 births and 14,811 deaths within the City; the numbers for the corresponding period of the previous year, 1879, were 20,844 births and 14,502 deaths.

Of the births 10,619 were males and 10,164 were females, making the total Birth-rate of the City equal to 38·2 per 1,000, being the exact average of the previous ten years.

DEATHS.

Of the 14,811 deaths 7,636 were of males, and 7,175 of females; 6,980 occurred in the Parish, and 7,831 in the Out-townships.

The Death-rate of the City was equal to 27·2 per 1,000. The average of the previous ten years was 28·9 per 1,000.

The following table shows the actual number of deaths registered in the Parish and Out-townships, previous to the transference to the districts from whence the patients were removed, of the deaths occurring in the Workhouses and Hospitals. The Death-rate of the Parish was equal to 32·8, and that of the Out-townships to 21·6, per 1,000 of the population.

From the returns made as to the residences of persons dying in the Workhouses and Hospitals of the town, we are able to classify 1,667 of the deaths in these establishments under the wards and districts from whence the patients were removed, viz., 341 under Scotland Ward, 160 under Vauxhall Ward, 131 under St. Paul's and Exchange Wards (Dale Street District), 257 under St. Anne's and Lime Street Wards (Islington District), 31 under Castle Street and St. Peter's Wards (St. George's District), 122 under Pitt Street and Great George's Wards (St. Thomas's District), 160 under Rodney Street and Abercromby Wards (Mount Pleasant District), 190 under the Out-township of Everton, 66 under that of Kirkdale, 99 under that of West Derby, and 110 under those of the Toxteths. This will leave unclassified 229 deaths of persons whose previous residences were either unknown or not specified ;

and these, in the absence of definite information, have been placed in the Wards in proportion to the number of total deaths; and 132 who were residents outside the City.

The results of the alterations occasioned by this re-arrangement of the deaths in the wards and districts will be shown in the following table, from which a calculated rate of mortality per 1,000 of the estimated inhabitants has been made; but it must be observed that the estimate of the population of all the districts in the Parish has been made on a rate of decrease which is probably in excess of what is going on.

The deaths of Infants below the fifth year of their age amounted to 7,341, and thus comprised 49·6 per cent. of the whole deaths; the average number for the preceding ten years was 7,021, and the average percentage 47·0. The deaths of Infants below one year of age amounted to 3,961, or 19·1 per cent. of all the children born within the City died before attaining the age of twelve months.

The first of the following tables shows the districts where Infantile Mortality was relatively and absolutely greatest, the second table illustrates the influence of age on the death-rate of the City, and the third table places, in one connected view, the pathological history of the death registry.

ZYMOTICS.

This class of diseases occasioned 3,173 deaths during the year 1880, and accounted for 21·4 per cent. of the total mortality within the City during the same period. The average number of deaths from these diseases for the preceding ten years was 3,652, and the percentage death rate for 1880 was 2·7 per cent. less than the proportional rate of zymotic deaths to deaths from all causes during the preceding decennial period. FEVER.

Fever accounted for 256 deaths within the City of Liverpool, or for 124 in the Parish and 132 in the Out-Townships. (The average number of deaths for the preceding ten years was 440). The rate of its mortality was equal to 0·5 per 1,000 of the estimated population. Its percentage rate relatively to deaths from all causes was 1·5 during the first, 1·4 during the second, 1·7 during the third, and 2·3 during the fourth quarter of the year. Its annual rate relatively to deaths from all causes

was 1·7 per cent., and relatively to deaths from zymotic causes 8·1 per cent. Its deaths included 141 males and 115 females; 81 persons below the age of 15, 66 between the ages of 15 and 30, and 109 above the age of 30.

Under the term Fever every form of continued fever is included; but the registers of deaths attribute 7 cases to gastric fever, 96 to typhoid fever, 38 to enteric fever, 6 to continued fever, 2 to low fever, 87 to typhus, 13 to fever, and under that of febricula 7 deaths.

The following tables are in themselves sufficiently explanatory. The first compares the averages of deaths from fever during the preceding ten years with those during 1880; the second and third tables show the districts of the town and the periods of the year in which all forms of continued fever were most fatally prevalent; the fourth marks in streets the habitats of the disease; and the remaining tables the occupations and positions of its victims.

SCARLATINA.

Scarlatina accounted during the year for 465 deaths, or for 214 in the Parish, and 251 in the Out-townships. (The average number of deaths for the preceding ten years was 687). The rate of its mortality was equal to 0·9 per 1,000 of the estimated population. Its rate relatively to deaths

from all causes was 2·8 per cent. in the first quarter, 2·3 in the second, 2·1 in the third, and 5·5 in the fourth quarter of the year; its annual rate relatively to all deaths was 3·1 per cent., and relatively to deaths from zymotic causes 14·7 per cent.

The first of the following tables gives a statistical history of the mortality of Scarlatina during the year 1880; the second is a record of the streets of the City wherein 3 or more deaths occurred from that disease.

TUBERCULAR DISEASES.

This group of diseases includes Phthisis, Scrofula, Tabes Mesenterica, and Hydrocephalus. They occasioned 2,007 deaths in the City of Liverpool during the year 1880, of which 873 occurred in the Parish, and 1,134 in the Out-Townships. (The average number of deaths for the preceding ten years was 2,003). The death-rate was 3·7 per 1,000 of the estimated population; their percentage death-rate relatively to deaths from all causes was 13·6.

PHTHISIS.

The deaths from Phthisis amounted to 1,337, and show a gradual decrease, the average number for the preceding ten years being 1,539.

The average number of cases of Measles at one time in Hospital during the year was 7, and the percentage Death-rate was 25·7; the average number of cases of Scarlatina at one time in the Hospital during the year was 11, and the percentage Death-rate was 16·9.

The number of persons in receipt of Parochial Relief on Saturday, 26th of June, 1880, was 6,076, or 146 more than at the corresponding period of 1879; and the number on Saturday, the 25th December, 1880, was 6,962, or 232 more than at the same period of 1879.

LODGING-HOUSES.

The Health Committee have, since the passing of the Sanitary Act, 1866, ruled that, as far as possible, all registered lodging-houses should have a day apartment for the accommodation of their lodgers, and that all houses where single rooms were occupied by day and night should be registered as sub-let. The space required for a night lodger in a registered lodging-house is 300 cubical feet, while the space in a sub-let house for each adult is 350 feet.

There were on the register 1,064 lodging-houses at the end of 1879, and 1,088 at the end of 1880. This difference was occasioned by the removal of 283 old licenses, and the addition of 307 new ones. The visits to lodging-houses are both by day and night. The lodging-houses of the better class, and especially those provided only with single beds for each person, and only with the number of beds equivalent to the number of lodgers allowed, are not visited at night except on grave suspicion or on complaint, or in the case of foreign emigrant lodging-houses. The night visits are pretty nearly restricted to the low districts and tramp houses. The number of day visits paid during the year was 42,099, and the night visits 6,444. The number of lodging-houses found overcrowded on the night visits was 56, the number of informations laid for breaches of the bye-laws was 156, with the results of fines in 146 cases to the extent of £27 15s. 6d., in sums varying from 1s. to 10s. and costs. The number of lodging-houses found dirty was 210; notices were served to lime-wash and cleanse.

It is necessary frequently to visit houses which are not licensed either as lodging or sub-let houses, especially when emigration is brisk or at race times. There were 2,887 such visits paid during the day, and in 88 of the cases where suspicion was confirmed they were followed up by night visits. A tenant harbouring lodgers is not taken before the Justices for the first offence, but is noticed to apply to have his rooms measured and licensed. There were 260 such notices issued during the year, but in only 15 cases did the tenants refuse to comply; they were brought before the Justices and fined. A bye-law requires that every case of infectious sickness in a lodging-house should be at once reported to the Medical Officer of Health. 33 cases of fever and one case of small pox occurred in lodging-houses; in 26 of the cases the patients were at once sent to hospital, the remaining 8, being members of the keepers' families, were not removed; 4 of these latter died. In all cases of fever or infectious disease the bedding was at once removed to the disinfecting apparatus, and the rooms purified and cleansed; in the cases where the patients remained, the licenses to receive lodgers were suspended by the Medical Officer. No

lodger died from fever or small pox in a registered lodging-house; but, not including the cases of fever, there were 128 deaths from non-contagious diseases in lodging-houses, of which 94 belonged to the keepers' families and 34 were lodgers.

SUB-LET HOUSES.

The number of sub-let Houses on the Register at the termination of 1879 was 13,144; the number registered during 1880 was 1044, making the total on the Register on the 31st December, 14,188. The number of visits paid during the night was 11,656, and during the day 68,858, with the result of finding 1,474 rooms overcrowded. In addition to overcrowding, the offence (though not punishable in sub-let houses) of permitting males and females not married to occupy the same room comes under the notice, and is entered in the books of the Inspectors. There were 962 rooms thus indecently occupied by 1,435 males and 1,643 females, besides having also in these rooms 709 children between the ages of 5 and 13 years. The character of the indecent occupation may be judged of from the following facts:—In 483 instances one man and two women were found in the same bedroom; in 313 instances two men and one woman; in 71 instances two men and two women; in 45 instances one man and three women; in 29 instances three men and one woman; in eight instances two men and three women; in four instances three men and two women; in three instances one man and four women; in two instances three men and three women; in one instance two men and four women; in one instance four men and one woman; and in one instance nine men and three women.

Informations were laid against 1,212 chief tenants for permitting overcrowding in rooms, with the following results:—3 were fined 1s; 991 fined 1s. and 1s. costs; 2 fined 1s. and 1s. 6d. costs; 3 fined 2s. and 1s. costs; 4 fined 2s. and 2s. costs; 1 fined 2s. 6d. and 1s. costs; 147 fined 2s. 6d. and 2s. 6d. costs; 26 fined 5s. and 4s. 6d. costs; 9 fined 10s. and 4s. 6d. costs; and 2 fined 20s. and 4s. 6d. costs; making a total of fines levied during the year of £159. Of the remaining 24 cases, 16 informations were withdrawn and 8 acquitted, the tenants having abated the overcrowding.

LICENSES FOR CATTLE.

During the year 1880, 38 applications were made to the Health Committee for licenses to keep cows; 37 of the applications for keeping 346 cows were granted. There are at present 450 shippens licensed to keep 5,322 cows. 84 of the shippens previously licensed have been transferred to fresh tenants.

17 applications were made during the year to keep pigs in styres separate from, and unconnected with, shippens; 3 of the applications for keeping 8 pigs were granted. 14 piggeries, licensed to keep 32 pigs, have been given up during the year. 8 piggeries previously licensed have been transferred to fresh tenants. The total number of premises or styres now licensed in the City is 153, for keeping 461 pigs.

CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

This Act was referred to the Medical Officer to carry out in conjunction with the Veterinary Surgeon, the Inspector of Nuisances, and the Meat Inspectors. During the year Pleuro-pneumonia was found in 3 cowsheds, affecting 14 cows, which were slaughtered by order of the owners or of the Corporation; and 14 cows, which were not diseased, but had been either in contact with the affected ones or in the same cowsheds, were slaughtered by order of the owners.

Pig Typhoid was found amongst the swine imported from Ireland. The disease was detected in 13 pigs.

Of the patients removed to Hospital the following were conveyed by the Sanitary Officers:—348 cases of Fever and Scarlatina, 5 cases of Small Pox, 14 cases of Measles, and 2 cases of Diphtheria, making a total of 369 persons. 88 were taken to Netherfield Road Hospital, 248 to the Parish Workhouse Hospital, 9 to Toxteth Workhouse Hospital, and 24 to West Derby Union Hospital.

DISINFECTION OF HOUSES.

In all cases of infectious disease the houses were disinfected, free of cost, with sulphurous gas, by officers appointed by the Health Committee; but whenever there was sickness in any room of the house, so as to endanger health by the use of sulphurous gas, carbolic acid powder was freely sprinkled in the rooms and passages of the house until the sulphurous gas could be used safely. No house is considered properly disinfected until sulphurous gas has been used. The existence of sickness, and the consequent employment of carbolic acid powder, necessitate many visits by the persons in charge of disinfection. There were in all 4,059 visits paid during the year to houses for the purpose of disinfection, the number of houses properly disinfected being 1,759.

THE DISINFECTING APPARATUS.

IN 1880.

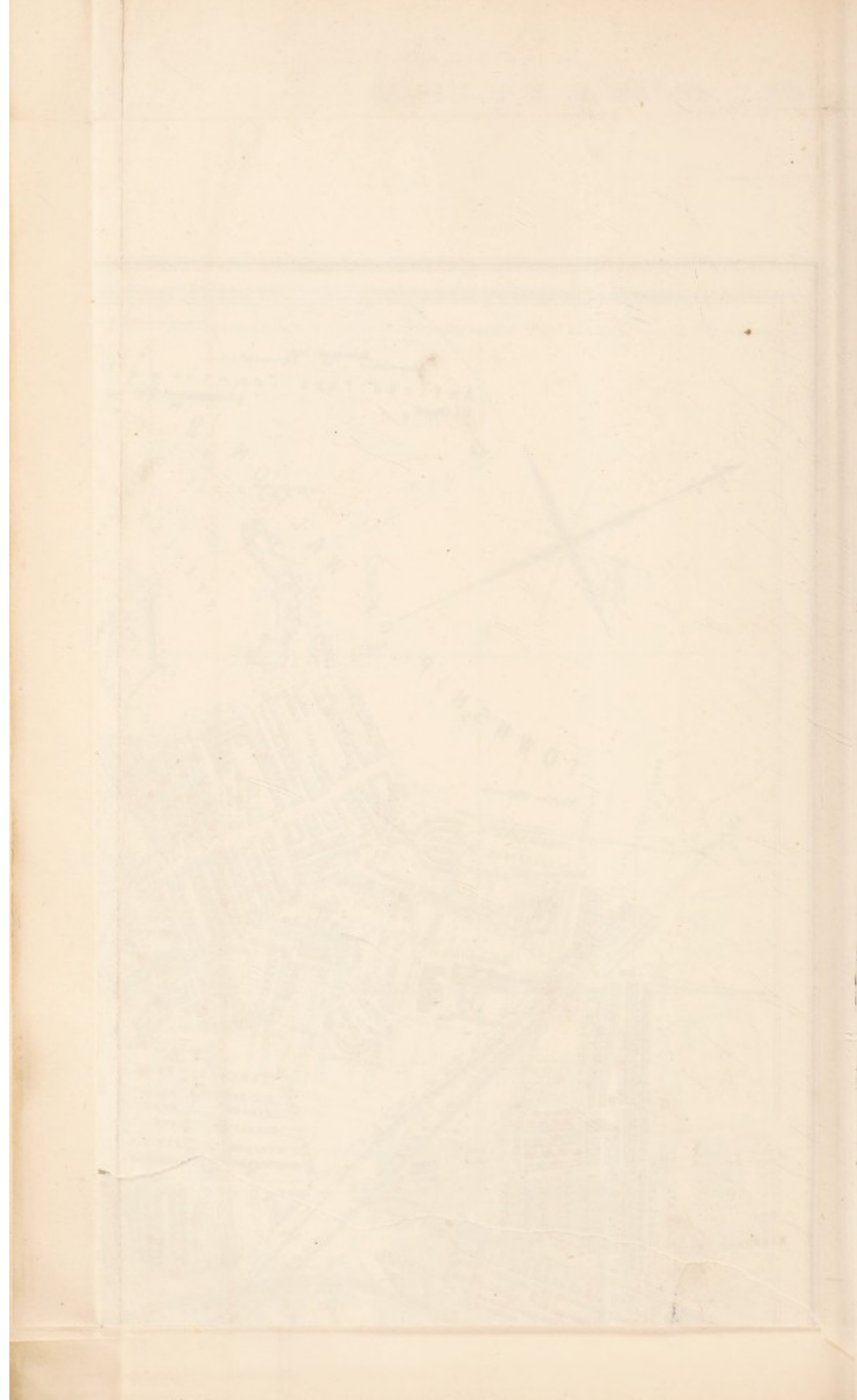
