The sum represented by a penny rate was £52. (cash basis).

The Water Supply remains the same. There was no shortage. Bacteriological Examinations are carried out monthly and the reports have been invariably good, and Chlorination was satisfactory.

The other Public Health Services remain the same.

On the 31st March, Mr. J. Topham, the Sanitary Inspector resigned, and on the 3rd of May, Mr. D.C. Nicol, M.S.I.A., was appointed. He is also Meat Inspector.
