Mr. Mayor, Aldermen and Councillors:-

The area of the Borough is 11.937 acres.

The Resident Population, according to the Registrar General's returns was:- 1521.

The number of inhabited houses at the end of the year 1944, according to the Rate Books was:- 961.

The Rateable Value was £14,991.

The sum represented by a penny rate was £53.

The cases of Scarlet Fever and Diphtheria were sent to the Ashford Isolation Hospital.

#### WATER SUPPLY:-

The supply remains the same and there was no shortage during the year. Thirteen samples were examined bacteriologically at the County Pathological Laboratory and all except one were returned as good. The exception was investigated and was probably due to war conditions, and the next samples were good. Slight over-chlorination occurred on four occasions but not to the extent it did in the past.

There is no plumbic-solvent action. The catchment area of the Littlestone Water Company is being carefully watched for any form of contamination. About 60% of the dwelling houses are directly attached to the Water Mains and 75% of the population derives its water supply thus. Some 10% of the dwelling houses get their water from standpipes and 15% of the population derives its water supply thus.

#### HOUSING:-

A very large number of houses have been damaged by enemy action, some beyond repair, and the necessity for first-aid repairs has prevented the commencement of the general housing survey which the Ministry requires. Post War Housing Schemes for Temporary (30), and Permanent (50) houses are in course of preparation.
