There are no piped supplies of water in the area liable to plumbo-solvent action.

No public supplies were found to be contaminated as a result of analysis.

There are approximately 5,000 dwelling-houses in the area, 4,180 of these, representing a population of about 15,000, have piped water supplies direct to the houses. Forty, representing a population of approximately 140, are supplied by a stand-pipe.

The extension to public water mains during the year was 3,740 lineal yards in the parish of Siddington.

DRAINAGE AND SEWERAGE.

There were no extensions made to the public sewer system during the year.

The districts acutely in need of main sewer are the Langley area of Sutton and the Knutsford Road areas of Chorley and Great Warford, these having been referred to in previous annual reports since 1937. Main sewerage systems are also needed in the villages of Kettleshulme, Mottram St. Andrew and Bosley.

PUBLIC CLEANSING.

The Council's House Refuse Collecting Service includes the whole or parts of all the parishes in the area.

REFUSE TIPS.

The number of refuse tips are eight and there are two full time men engaged on their control.
