LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

In submitting to you the Ninth Annual Report of the School Medical Officer for the year ended 31st December, 1916, I take the opportunity of expressing my sincere thanks to the School Teachers, the School Attendance Officer, and the School Nurse for the valuable assistance which they have given me in carrying out the routine inspection at school and also in the several other branches of work which arise from it.

In former years it has been my custom to discuss separately the various conditions discovered in the course of these inspections, but now, owing to the exigences of war-time, I shall confine my remarks to a few general observations.

Approximately the same number of scholars were examined in the schools as in previous years, the grand total (including special cases) being 840. The various groups and classes to which these examinees belong, and the numbers inspected in each department at each school is shown in Table A, which also gives the corresponding figures for 1915.

In 53 instances a scholar due for inspection was absent for illness or some other cause, and in 7 cases the parents sent notice of their objection to the child being examined. The attendance of parents at these inspections was somewhat better than in previous years (62.9% as against 53.4%) the greater proportion appear with the young children of the "entrant" or five year old group and comparatively few with fourth or "leaver" group, whose ages are 12 years or over.

The next table (Table B) indicates the general physical and hygenic condition of the children examined. In the main, the percentages are similar to those recorded in previous years, but one or two exceptions are worthy of remark. It will be noticed for instance those marked as of "poor" nutrition, only amounted to 2.6% of total examined, while the corresponding figures for 1915 and the previous years were roughly double. Bad boots and insufficient clothing were somewhat more common, but there is a distinct improvement in the figure for ragged and dirty clothing.

Some improvement is also noticed in regard to nits and vermin in the hair as compared with the previous year, but as the worst cases are generally tidied up in anticipation of inspection the figures give a better rather than a worse complexion to the real state of affairs. The same remarks also apply to the cleanliness of the clothing and body.

With regard to physical defects which are set out in Table C, there is a diminution in the numbers suffering from excessive enlargement of the tonsils and the presence of adenoids which obstruct the breathing passages, and this is largely accounted for by the number who have been surgically treated in previous years, either through the school clinic or privately at the Ray Mead Children's Hospital and elsewhere. The same is noticeable among those who have defective eyesight (6/18 or less in one or both eyes) and in direct relation with this observation, it should be noted that the proportion of scholars wearing glasses is correspondingly increased. Other defects do not call for any special remarks as they have already been discussed in the preceding reports. (See especially Report for 1914, pp 16-20.

The record of past illnesses, measles, whooping cough, etc., is given in Table D. This also has been frequently commented upon in the reports, and need not be further elaborated, as the figures are much the same from year to year, viz., 80% have had measles, 45% whooping cough, 25% to 30% chickenpox, 5-6% scarlet fever, diphtheria, and the same for other illness added together.

The various ailments which have affected school attendance during each month of the past year are recorded in the following list:—

JANUARY ... Influenza.

February. Coughs, Colds, and several cases of Whooping Cough.

March..... Coughs and Colds. In the Infants'
Schools Measles and Whooping
Cough.

April Measles. Three Infant departments closed.

MAY..... Very little sickness.

JUNE Sickness and Sore Throats.

July..... Very little sickness.

SEPTEMBER. Sore Throats.

OCTOBER... Sore Throats, Colds, and Diarrhoea.

NOVEMBER. Coughs and Colds.

DECEMBER. Influenza and Swollen Glands.

The weekly Inspection Clinic for examination of scholars, whose fitness to attend school is in question, or who are under observation was open every Friday during school terms. The total number of cases dealt with amounted to 174, and the total attendances 492. The various ailments which they suffered from and other particulars are shown in Table E.

The practical results of school medical inspection. in regard to the more important defects are detailed in Table F which shows the nature of defect, the number of cases, and where treatment was obtained. At the end of 1915 there were 28 cases outstanding, and of these, 8 were treated during 1916, 3 left the district, and the remaining 17, either refused treatment or are still outstanding. Of the 103 cases in 1916, where printed notices were given calling attention to defects, 72 were treated up to end of March, 1917, in 10 cases no definite information as to result of the notice could be obtained, and 21 had either refused treatment or were waiting for a more favourble opportunity. In this connection it is much to be regretted that the services of the School Nurse were temporarily dispensed with

during the early part of the year, the more so as that action completely upset the arrangements for regular attendance at the treatment clinic and for systematic following up. Later on, a further difficulty in the way of securing treatment arose from the fact that several of the members of the staff of the Cottage Hospital, who were chiefly concerned with the treatment of school children, had entered on military service, so that it was not always possible to conduct the clinic on days appointed.

As in previous years, advantage has been taken of local charities, particularly the Mayor's fund, to assist deserving persons in the purchasing of spectacles, surgical boots and similar requirements, and also in supplying milk to be given at school to certain poorly nourished or weakly children.

Reviewing the year's work as a whole, it may be described as distinctly satisfactory, considering the difficulties one has to contend with in war-time, and the fact that the annual grant from the Board of Education, in respect of School Medical Service, for the past year amounted to £47 18s. 4d., the highest yet received, shows that steady progress is being made.
