





V. MEASURES AGAINST RODENTS.

(1) Deratization or Deratization Exemption Certificates of vessels inspected are examined.

(2) Foreign-going vessels very rarely lie at guays. No trouble with rats has ever been experienced.



(3) (a) There are no facilities in the Port for deratization of ships.

(b) There are no rat-infested premises in the vicinity of the quays.

(4) The Sanitary Inspector for the Borough and the Port stevedores have been instructed to report the occurrence of rats in the vicinity of the Port.

(5) No special measures of rat-proofing have been found necessary.

TABLES E AND F.

No rats have been destroyed during 1944 on board vessels. A few have been killed on shore by private individuals. None by the Port Sanitary Authority.
