SANITARY CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE DISTRICTMeat Inspection

During the year, the reconstruction of the Slaughter-house was completed, and has resulted in considerable improvement.

In addition to slaughtering for the normal meat trade the premises are now being used for the slaughter of 're-actor' called from Attested herds and this accounts entirely for the increased incidence of tuberculosis.

The recent legislation on meat marketing has increased the work of the department, precluding, as it does almost entirely the use of semi-skilled inspectorate.

In addition the relatively large amount of 'export' meat killed, involves an appreciable amount of work outside normal office hours.

The sewage works purifies the whole output from Malton Urban District Council and the adjoining Norton Urban District Council, the works being administered by a Joint Committee.

The effluent produced is almost always satisfactory, but enlargement of the works may be necessary to some degree in the near future because the Norton Urban District Council propose to instal new pumping plant which will have the effect of increasing the rate of flow from that area.

The big short coming of the works is the unadequacy of 'sludge' disposal which is deposited on land alongside the works, and is a product for which, a source of disposal is not always readily available.
