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

2. WATER.

THERE HAVE BEEN EXTENSIONS TO NEW HOUSING SITES AT IBSTOCK, CONGERSTONE, NEWBOLD VERDON, NAILSTONE AND MARKET BOSWORTH. THE VILLAGES OF NORTON JUXTA TWYCROSS, SUTTON CHENEY AND KIRKBY MALLORY HAVE BEEN PROVIDED WITH MAINS WATER SUPPLY. A SCHEME FOR THE WHOLE OF THE SOUTHERN AREA OF THE DISTRICT HAS BEEN PLANNED WITH THE CO-OPERATION OF THE AGRICULTURAL EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE TO SUPPLY FARMS AND VILLAGES.

3. SEWERS.

THE NEWBOLD VERDON SCHEME IS NOW COMPLETED AND CONVERSIONS GRADUALLY BEING CARRIED OUT. THE "FLYING HORSE" SCHEME IS ALSO IN OPERATION. THE LARGE SCHEME EMBRACING BAGWORTH, THORNTON, BATTRAM AND ELLISTOWN HAS COMMENCED AND THE VILLAGE OF THORNTON IS SEWERED.

IT IS BECOMING STILL MORE EVIDENT THAT SOME OF THE EXISTING SEWAGE WORKS REQUIRE ENLARGING.
