CONTROL AND PREVENTION OF INFECTIOUS DISEASE.

Tuberculosis.

There were no deaths from tuberculosis during the year.

No new case of pulmonary tuberculosis was notified. This is only the second occasion on which it has been possible to make this observation, the previous year of freedom from new notification being 1965.

SANITARY CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE AREA

Water Supply.

The water supply continues to be satisfactory in quality and quantity. Four samples of drinking water were taken and proved on bacteriological examination to be sterile.

There is only one occupied house in the district still dependent on a shallow well for domestic water supply. This water was again sampled and found to be bacteriologically satisfactory.

Only minor extensions were made to water services for the purposes of new development. The new service reservoir on Burnmill Hill was completed and put into use.

Sewerage and Sewage Disposal.

Again no extensions to public sewers were made other than minor ones for new housing development. At present no scheme is in hand for extensions or alterations at the Sewage Disposal Works.

Trouble with filter beds caused by trade effluent called for a stricter control of factory wastes. All factories likely to be producing a trade effluent were approached. Conditional Consents were given in four instances.

Public Cleansing.

This service is administered by the Engineer & Surveyor. House refuse is collected by direct labour and disposed of by controlled tipping. Agreement has been reached with a neighbouring Authority on terms for joint use of that Authority's tip. This has not yet been implemented.

Trade refuse collection service is administered by the Health Department. A weekly collection is made from 152 trade premises of the equivalent of 299 bins, at a pro rata charge of £3 per bin per annum. Bulk refuse is collected from certain other factories on a cost-recovery basis.

Water Supply

The water supply continues to be satisfactory in quality and quantity. Some samples of drinking water were taken and proved on bacteriological examination to be sterile.

There is only one complaint made in the District with regard to a failure of the domestic water supply. This water was again sampled and found to be bacteriologically satisfactory.

Only minor alterations were made to water services for the purpose of new development. The new service reservoir at Boreham Hill has completed and put into use.

Sanitation and Sewerage Disposal

Again no extensions to public sewers were made other than minor ones for new housing development. At present no scheme is in hand for extensions or alterations at the Boreham Hill Sewerage Works.

People who filter beds caused by trade effluent called for a stricter control of factory wastes. All factories likely to be producing a trade effluent were approached. Conditional consents were given in four instances.

Public Cleansing

This service is administered by the Corporation & Surveyors. It is collected by street labour and disposed of by controlled tipping. Agreement has been reached with a neighbouring Authority on terms for joint use of that Authority's tip. This has not yet been implemented.

Trade refuse collection service is administered by the Health Department. A weekly collection is made from the trade premises at the equivalent of 100 tons, at a rate of 10/- per ton per annum. This refuse is collected from certain other trades at a half-recovery rate.

Five inspections were made of these premises and conditions found to be generally satisfactory.

Prevention of Damage by Pests Act, 1949.

Routine inspection of the District is carried out by the Rodent Officer and his assistant, as other Health Department duties permit. 2,160 visits and inspections were made in survey and treatment of rodent infestations. 207 infestations were dealt with. Rodent infestations on domestic premises are treated free, a charge being made for work done at business or agricultural premises. Regular inspections and treatments as required are carried out at all Council properties.

Swimming Baths.

26 inspections of the Public Swimming Baths were made. Plant and premises are inspected, and tests carried out of the swimming water. 3 samples were examined bacteriologically and found to be satisfactory.

Caravan Sites and Control of Development Act, 1960.

There are 4 licences operative in respect of single caravan sites, and 1 licence for a site for 40 residential caravans. No new licences were issued this year.

Living vans were removed from unlicensed sites on 5 occasions.

Noise Abatement Act, 1960.

No formal action was taken during the year. Silencers which were being installed at one factory at the beginning of the year proved successful in eliminating noise nuisance from the premises. Though not considered a statutory nuisance, the noise from other factory premises continues to give rise to complaint by neighbouring residents. Ways of reducing those noises still further are being sought by informal approaches to management.
