I have pleasure in presenting a Report for the Year 1925.

GENERAL STATISTICS.

PHYSICAL FEATURES AND GENERAL CHARACTER OF THE AREA

The whole of the district is very hilly, and the elevation varies. In the extreme south at Prestwood it is 365 feet above sea level, and at Alstonefield and Wetton in the extreme north, it rises to 942 feet. The Northern portion of the district lies on the mountain limestone; the middle portion of the district on the mountain limestone, millstone grit and shale, and the southern portion on bunster sandstone, kouper candstone and keuper marl. In winter months the locomotion is very difficult, as the roads are at times almost impassible with heavy snows and frost The Farm Houses, Buildings and Cottages are in many cases situated in isolated and remote places, in some cases at considerable distances from the main roads and villages. These buildings are chiefly built of stone, are very old, and originally not well constructed.

There are no Hopsitals in the area, but cases can be sent into neighbouring towns where there are Hospitals, viz: Ashborne, Derby, Etwall, Hartshill.

Infant Welfare Clinics are held in cortain Villages and the Health Visitors visit the Infants born in the district. The Health Officers consist of a part time Medical Officer and a whole time Sanitary Inspector assisted by five Health Visitors who are also Certified Midwives and act also as District Nurses.

The Milk produced in the district is sold in bulk to various Factories and private firms away from the district.

PREVALENCE OF AND CONTROL OVER INFECTIOUS DISEASES.

No general epidemic of infectious disease occurred during the year - odd cases of chicken pox and whooping cough occurred - no oubreak of influenza occurred.

NOTIFIABLE DISEASES DURING THE YEAR.

Scarlet Fever - 2 cases. Meningitis - 1 case - Fatal Diptheria - 2 cases - both sent to Etwall Isolation Hospital Pnoumonia - 1 case Erysepelas - 1 case.

TUBERCULOSIS.

Six cases notified. 1 Male aged 46 years - Pulmonary Tuberculosis. 4 Females ages 24 to 36 years of Pulmonary Tuberculosis. 1 Male died, aged 25 years, of Pulmonary Tuberculosis 1 Female notified, aged 52 years of Non-pulmonary Tubercul-1 Female died, aged 19 years of pulmonary

The Tuberculosis patients are visited by the Health Visitors and attend Clinics in Uttoxeter and Hope when necessary.

No centre for venercal diseases in the district, and no case of opthalmia neonatorium or puerperal fever were notified

HOUSING.

Your Sanitary Inspector has given attention to the filter beds and outfall works at Ellastone, and the effluent has been satisfactory.

DAIRIES AND COWEHEDS.

Your Sanitary Inspector carried out several inspections of Dairies and Cowaheds during the Year.

SLAUGHTER HOUSES.

The Council registered one Slaughter House at Alstonefield, one at Waterfall, and one at Winkhill during the year - These have been periodically inspected and kept in good sanitary condition.

COMMON LODGING HOUSES, CANALS, AND BAKEHOUSES.

There are none of the above in the District.

PRIVIES AND OTHER CLOSETS

Privies are the type of closet mostly in use in the District, the number of pan closets and Water Closets being small.

CLEANSING OF PRIVIES ETC.

The cleansing of privies, pan closets, ashpits, and cesspools is carried out by the owners and occupiers of premises, and on the whole is done efficiently - period--ical inspections are made by the Sanitary Inspector.

PACTORIES AND WORKSHOPS.

All buildings coming within the provisions of the Factory Acts are regularly inspected, and have been found clean and well kept.

NURSING ASSOCIATIONS, HOSPITALS, ETC., AVAILABLE IN THE DISTRICT.

Most Villages have a District Nurse who is also a Certified Midwife, and who visits cases where necessary.

Persons suffering from infectious disease are removed to the Etwall Isolation Hospital for treatment.

The examination of specimens takes place at The County laboratory, Lichfield, free of charge.

To the Chairman and Members of the Mayfield Rural District Council:-

Mr Chairman and Gentlemen,

I herewith beg. to lay before you my Annual Report, covering the period commencing the 1st January 1925 to the 31st December 1925.

The Council continued their work as in previous years and were again able to secure the various attention to insanitary matters on private premises without resource to legal steps.

HOUSING.

One new house has been erected during the year and the Council received an application for a subsidy of £100 towards the cost of its erection. This is the only application that has been made although the Council advertised in the Local Newspapers that they would be prepared to make such grants.

The inspection of houses has been carried out during the year, and the owners called upon to remedy any defects found.

None of the houses inspected were found to be unfit for human habitation.

The nine houses built by the Council at Mayfield have been inspected periodically and minor repairs carried out.

WATER SUPPLY.

The sources of water supplies throughout the District are wells and stored rainwater.

The Parish of Ramshorn, and the parts of Mayfield, known as the Mill Yard, Mayfield, and Church and Middle May-field, are provided with a constant supply of water by the Land Owners conveyed to the various premises by means of pipes.

Upper and other parts of Mayfield are supplied from the Council's Mains.

The village of Waterhouses is also provided with water from mains laid by the Council.

Alstonfield Village is supplied from two storage reservoirs, to which is connected a hand pump. The only available supply at Calton, and the hilly parts of the District is stored rainwater. At Ellastone, Ilam, Stanton, Swinscoe, Waterfall, and Wetton, there are public wells and pumps which supply the villages; the other supplies in the District being obtained from private wells.
