C. SANITARY CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE DISTRICT.

Sanitary Inspection of the District.—Table I. gives a summary of inspections, and in the Sanitary Inspector's reports will be found full details on this matter, as well as on the premises controlled by Bye-Laws.

1. (i) Water.—The district is favourably situated in respect of piped supplies of water. Of the 24 parishes, 11 have between 80 and 95% of the dwellings supplied; 7 have between 25 and 75%, and the remaining 6 parishes depend largely on separate wells. The mains are continually being extended.

Drainage and Sewerage.—Twelve parishes have main sewerage.

Public Cleansing.—No change.

SANITARY INSPECTIONS OF THE AREA.—See Table I.

D. HOUSING.

Full particulars of the usual Table have been compiled and are being kept for Record purposes, but with a view to economy it is not being printed.

(b) Housing Conditions.

- General Observations.—This question was discussed fully in the Report for 1930, to which reference may be made.
- 2. Sufficiency of the Supply of Houses.—There are now 247 Council houses in the district, but it is certain that the demand still exists.
- 4. Fitness of Houses.—Representations were made during the year in respect to 2 dwellings, and in these cases undertakings not to use for human habitation were accepted from the owners.
- 5. Unhealthy Areas.—No Representations were made in respect to Clearance Areas.

E. INSPECTION AND SUPERVISION OF FOOD.

(a) Milk Supply.—The interest of the Inspectors in the maintenance of a clean milk supply has been kept up, in spite of calls on their time due to the War. Defects in premises and methods were reported monthly, and improvements numbering 81 were effected.

Clean Milk.

Two farms are licensed for tuberculin tested milk, and 108 are on the accredited roll. During the year 7 cow-keepers qualified newly for the latter.
