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C. SANITARY CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE DISTRICT.

SANITARY INSPECTION OF THE DISTRICT.—Table Igives a summary of inspections.

1. (i) WATER.—11 samples of water from old wells were submitted to the Analyst, whose results showed that only 3 were of good quality.

D. HOUSING.

Full particulars have been compiled and are being kept for Record purposes.

(b) Housing Conditions.

General Observations.—The position has by no means improved, and conditions exist which the Council would not have tolerated in previous years.

Fitness of Houses.—No representations were made during the year.

Unhealthy Areas.—No representations were made in respect of Clearance Areas.

E. INSPECTION AND SUPERVISION OF FOOD.

(a) Milk Supply.—The interest of the Inspectors in the maintenance of a clean milk supply has been kept up, in spite of calls on their time due to the War. Defects in premises and methods were reported monthly, and improvements numbering 18 were effected. These included 1 new cowshed, 7 new cowshed floors, and improvements in lighting, ventilation and drainage in 6 instances.

Six producers have newly qualified during the year for Accredited Licences, making a total of 122 for the District.

Samples of milk were sent for Methylene Blue tests; out of 21, 10 were good. Where bad samples were found advice was given and further samples proved satisfactory.
