## C. SANITARY CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE DISTRICT.

Sanitary Inspection of the District.—Table I. gives a summary of inspections.

1. (i) Water.—38 samples of water were submitted to the Analyst, whose results showed that 16 were of good quality.

### D. HOUSING.

Full particulars have been compiled and are being kept for Record purposes.

## (b) Housing Conditions.

General Observations.—The position has by no means improved, and conditions exist which the Council would not have tolerated in previous years.

Fitness of Houses.—No representations were made during the year.

Unhealthy Areas.—No representations were made in respect of Clearance Area.

### E. INSPECTION AND SUPERVISION OF FOOD.

(a) Milk Supply.—A lessening of duties arising out of the War has enabled the Inspectors to devote more time to milk production, and there was a rise in cowshed inspections from 271 in the previous year to 535 in the one under review. These inspections included visits at milking time, which are inclined to reveal much more than simple building inspections. A few cowshed floors were relaid, cooler places improved, etc.

Five producers have newly qualified during the year for accredited licences, making a total of 127 for the District.

Samples of milk were sent for Methylene Blue tests; out of 21, 10 were good. Where bad samples were found advice was given and further samples proved satisfactory.
