C. SANITARY CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE DISTRICT.

Sanitary Inspection of the District.—Table I. gives a summary of inspections.

1. (i) Water.—29 samples of water were submitted to the Analyst, whose results showed that 6 were of good quality, 5 unsatisfactory, and 18 condemned.

During the year the ancient spring at Berkswell Village failed, and the Coventry mains were extended so as to afford supplies to the 45 dwellings and 1 school. Two other extensions (for 8 dwellings) were made.

- (1). No complaints were received during the year as to the quality or quantity of supplies in the Birmingham and Coventry areas.
 - (2). No examinations of mains water were made.
- (3). No action for contamination of pipes supplies has been necessary.
- (4). Houses with supplies from public water mains number 6,322 (a, direct to houses) and about 100 only (b) by means of standpipes. The proportion of dwelling houses on public water mains amounts to 74 per cent. of the total.

D. HOUSING.

Representatives of the Rural District Councils and the County Council conferred in October and produced a Joint Rural Housing Advisory Committee, which dealt at considerable length with the proposals for a survey of working class dwellings and the standard of fitness to be applied in the survey and in housing programmes.

(b) Housing Conditions.

General Observations.—The situation is known, from records of council house applicants in the department, to be serious, with some crowding on permitted-number standard and a great deal of undesirable sharing of rooms, kitchens and conveniences with general unhappiness all round, chiefly for women and children.

E. INSPECTION AND SUPERVISION OF FOOD.

- (a) Milk Supply.—Sampling under the Milk Testing and Advisory Scheme was continued until 1st August, when it was stopped. 1,180 samples were taken, and there is no doubt that much improvement was being effected.
 - (b) Advisory visits were made at milking time.

Diphtheria Immunisation.—Immunisation has continued during the year, and in all at the end of 1944 4,160 children had been treated in the schools and 1,386 either privately or at Infant Welfare Centres, giving a grand total up to December 31st, 1944, of 5,546.
