To the Health Committee of the Urban District of Milnrow

Mr. Cheirman and Members,

I have the honour of presenting my forty-third Annual Report of the District of Milmrow and shall commence by placing before you the General Statistics from which this report is formed:-

Population

The estimated population of the district for 1971 is 10,320 with an acreage of 5,194.

The rateable value of the district is £330,461 and the sum represented by the penny rate is £3,060.55.

The population is industrial and is occupied mainly with cotton, spinning, the engineering trade and the wool trade, none of which has any peculiar influence on the public health.

Maternity and Child Welfare

Clinic	There is a Maternity and Child Welfare Clinic (Consultation) open every Tuesday, 10 - 12 noon and 2.00 p.n. to 4.00 p.n.
Ante-Natal	Cases attend the clinic in Rochdale by arrangement or 1, Wesley Street, when the clinic is open.
Midwifery	Doniciliary nidwifery is carried out by nidwives under the control of the Lancashire County Council.
Hone Helps	The home help service is run by the Lancashire County Council, Divisional Health No. 13.
Cleansing Centre	Cases requiring treatment are treated at the Cleansing Centre in Rochdale.
Insunisation	Clinics are held monthly at the Maternity and Child Welfare Clinic on the first Wednesday in every month.
Anbulance Facilities	The ambulance service is administered by the Lancashire County Council from the Centre at Whitefield.
Infectious Diseases	The hospitals are administered by the Regional Hospital Board.
