In September 1970, a six year old girl became ill while travelling from South Wales to the Holiday Camp. She was admitted to hospital at Taunton where she was found to have Sonne Dysentery. She made a rapid recovery. The whole family returned home as soon as she was discharged from hospital. There were no further cases in the Camp. This episode was interesting because it revealed a previously unsuspected outbreak in the child's Infant School in South Wales.

A very large number of people come to the Holiday Camp from far and wide. It is not surprising that there are occasional importations of infectious disease. As a safeguard, the Infectious Disease Returns for the whole country are closely scrutinised. Thus, the Camp Doctor is fore warned if a camper from any area where there is a known outbreak of infectious illness reports sick.

There was one case of respiratory tuberculosis. The infection was acquired in London. Follow-up of the contacts at long range involved a considerable amount of work.

GENERAL PROVISIONS FOR HEALTH SERVICES FOR THE DISTRICT

Home Nursing, Midwives and Home Helps

The services are provided by the Health Department of the Somerset County Council.

Hospitals

The Minehead and West Somerset Hospital is managed by the West Somerset Hospital Management Committee. The Hospital provides medical, surgical and casualty treatment and out-patient clinics. A Family Planning Clinic is held at the Hospital.

Health and Dental Clinic

These are provided by the Somerset County Council at 54 Summerland Avenue, Minehead.

Nursing Homes

There is one nursing home in the district which provides 15 beds.

Ambulance Facilities

These facilities are provided by the Somerset County Council with ambulances stationed in Ninehead.

Old Persons Homes

Wyndham House, Martlet Road, which has 33 beds, is maintained by the Somerset County Council's Social Services Department. There are six private residential homes for the aged with 123 beds. Seventeen old persons dwellings with Warden accommodation are provided by the Council with grant aid from the Somerset County Council.

Water Supplies

The supply of water to the town is undertaken by the West Somerset Water Board. There are six sources of supply with Nutscale supplying the bulk of the water to the town and the other sources are from Broadwood, Longwood, Periton, Middlecombe and Moor Brake. All the sources, except Moor Brake which is from a borehole, are collected from land springs. All the supplies are chlorinated.

The supply of water was adequate during the year. Complaints have been made from time to time regarding the discolouration of the water which is due to the soft water corroding the iron mains. Frequent flushing of the mains was carried out by the Water Board.

Sewerage

The eastern sewerage system operated satisfactorily but the western area main sewer surcharged in August when heavy rain coincided with a high tide. The proposed new overflow manhole in Quay Street should prevent the flooding of the Quay Street cottages caused by this sewer surcharging.

Refuse Disposal

Further discussions with neighbouring authorities resulted in a decision being made to commence tipping at Rodhuish on 5th April, 1971 and Treborough Quarry on 1st April 1972. The closing of the Quay West tip will remove a long standing nuisance on the sea front and enable the Council to develop the site for amenity purposes.

Rodent Control

One part-time operator is employed to carry out the treatment of premises. Dwellinghouses are not charged for this service but the whole cost of treating business premises is recovered. During the year 61 properties were found to be infested with rats. A minor infestation of the sewers was found.

Offices, Shops and Railway Premises

There has been a further substantial decline in the number of persons employed.

Swimming Pools

There are three swimming pools in Minehead. The Lido, Warren Road is privately owned, and is filled with sea water; two are in the Holiday Camp and are filled with fresh water from the Camp supply. The treatment adopted to maintain their purity is re-circulation, filtration and automatic chlorination.

Samples are taken frequently to ensure that the degree of chlorination is maintained and there is no trace of bacterial infection. Results of the tests indicated that in all the pools a safe bathing water was maintained.

/Holiday Camp ...

Holiday Camp

The Camp caters for approximately 140,000 during the summer season. It is also open at Christmas. The Company provides a Hygiene Adviser who is, in fact, a retired qualified Public Health Inspector. Every effort was made to continue the improvement in the standard of hygiene. The proportion of chalet accommodation converted to self-service units was again increased. There are now709 self-service units at the Camp, which has reduced the number of prople served in the main dining hall.

INSPECTION OF FOOD AND FOOD PREMISES

The general standard of cleanliness of all food premises in the town was satisfactory and only minor informal action needed to be taken in a few cases.

The two untreated samples which were collected from Mr. F. G. Baker within the Urban District were both negative to the test for Brucella. He is licensed by the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food in the Rural District of Williton at Greenaleigh Farm, Minehead.

Two of the pasteurised samples failed the Methylene Blue test and two the phosphatase test.

Ice Cream

One property is registered for the manufacture and sale of ice cream and 58 premises for the sale of ice cream.

Meat

There is one privately owned abattoir in the district supplying meat for their own sales.

Food Poisoning

No cases of salmonella food poisoning were notified, although one case of salmonella typhimurium was admitted to the hospital from outside the town.

No substantial changes in the health of the Urban District occurred during 1970. The western sewer continued to give cause for concern. The closure of the Quay West Refuse Tip will be a considerable improvement.
