MR. MAYOR, LADY AND GENTLEMEN,

I have the honour to submit the fourth war-time Report markedly curtailed on the instructions of the Ministry of Health.

After four years of war there is still no evidence that the public health is suffering physically from strain or from the short supply of certain articles of diet.

The noteworthy vital statistics for the year are the increase in the birth rate, the highest since 1923, whilst the infantile mortality rate is the lowest on record.

The birth rate was 18·4 per 1000 living ; the birth rate for England and Wales being 15·8.

**DEATHS.**

The death rate was 12·3 per 1000 of the estimated resident population, the death rate for England and Wales being 11·6.

**INFANT MORTALITY.**

The Infantile Mortality rate was 17·8 per 1000 registered live births ; the rate for England and Wales generally was 49·0.

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**HOUSING.**

Only 130 houses were inspected under the Housing and Public Health Acts and of these 40 were found unfit.

One statutory notice was issued under the above Acts.

## INSPECTION AND SUPERVISION OF FOOD.

A large proportion of the animals slaughtered in the whole Island are killed at the Government controlled slaughter houses in the Borough and this has added greatly to the work of the Meat and Food Inspector.

## SECTION F.

### PREVALENCE OF AND CONTROL OVER INFECTIOUS AND OTHER DISEASES.

Apart from Measles and Whooping Cough the amount of infectious disease was small.

#### DIPHTHERIA IMMUNISATION.

The amount of major infectious disease was small and Diphtheria was absent.

Immunisation against Diphtheria still continues to be carried out and during the year 257 children under five and 233 over five and under fifteen completed the full course. On the estimated child population in these two groups it would appear that 58·5% of the under fives and 87·3% of the over fives have been immunised. The figure of 58·5% is better than it looks, for children are not immunised until they reach their first birthday, so that if the number of children under one are left out of the calculation then probably over 70% of the children who should be immunised are in fact done.
