CLINICS AND HOSPITALS IN THE DISTRICT

Tuberculosis Clinics

The Physician attends at:-

Oswestry and District Hospital, Upper Brook Street, Oswestry, every Friday from 1.30 p.m. to 4 p.m.

The Chest Clinic, Copthorne Hospital, Shrewsbury,
every Wednesday from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m.

Venereal Disease Clinics

Clinics are administered by the Regional Hospital Board and the one available to this area is held at

Local Health Authority Clinics

Under the National Health Service Act, 1946, the County Council being the Local Health Authority, provides child welfare clinics. The Clinic in Oswestry is held every Wednesday from 9.30 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. and from 1.30 p.m. to 4.30 p.m. at 30, Upper Brook Street. At Gobowen a clinic is held on the 2nd and 4th Monday in the month from 2.00 p.m. to 4.00 p.m. Whittington operates on the 1st and 3rd Tuesday in the month from 2.00 p.m. to 4.00 p.m. and St. Martins on the 2nd Tuesday in the month from 2.00 p.m. to 4.00 p.m.

Immunisation against Poliomyelitis, Diphtheria, Whooping Cough and Tetanus is provided, as is vaccination against Smallpox.

Clinics continued.

Welfare foods - orange juice, codliver oil preparations and other vitamin preparations, powdered milk and cereals for babies - are all on sale at the clinics. These items are also on sale daily except on Thursday.

The Clinics are staffed by experienced Health Visitors who can give advice on any problems connected with the rearing, feeding and management of babies and young children. A doctor is always in attendance.

Dental Clinics

The Salop County Council provides a dental service for expectant and nursing mothers and for pre-school age and school age children. The aim of the School Dental Service is to ensure that, as far as is practicable, children will leave school without the loss of permanent teeth, free from dental disease and irregularity, and trained in the care of their teeth.

The Dentist holds frequent weekly sessions in the Child Welfare Centre, 30, Upper Brook Street, Oswestry.

Child Guidance Clinics

The Child Psychiatrist sees children by appointment at the Child Welfare Centre, 30, Upper Brook Street, Oswestry and also in Shrewsbury. Sessions are also held in all parts of the county as and when the need arises.

All the aforementioned hospitals are administered by the Birmingham Regional Hospital Board which was constituted in accordance with the National Health Service Act.

AMBULANCE SERVICE

Under the National Health Service Act it became the duty of the County Council, the local health authority under the Act, to make provisions for securing that ambulances and other means of transport are available for the conveyance of persons suffering from physical or mental illness and expectant mothers or nursing mothers, from places in their area to places in or outside their area.

LABORATORY FACILITIES

This service is available at the Public Health Laboratory, Royal Salop Infirmary, Shrewsbury. Telephone: Shrewsbury 4684.

Dr. A.C. Jones is the Bacteriologist and the Pathologist is Dr. G. Grant.

The service is based on the Royal Salop Infirmary and undertakes work for local authorities free of charge in so far as it is relevant to diagnosis. It is invaluable particularly in the expeditious dealing with the bacteriological examination of food samples.

HOME HELP SERVICE

The Home Help Service is provided by the Salop County Council as one of its functions under Part III of the National Health Service Act. It helps to maintain the aged and the sick in their homes. This excellent service is supervised in Oswestry by Mrs. Roberts who has 44 home helps under her control at 32, Upper Brook Street, Oswestry.

NATIONAL BLOOD TRANSFUSION SERVICE

Blood transfusion during the course of serious illness, is for many people a life saving treatment. Loss of blood in accidents, childbirth or operation, cases of anaemia and severe burns all call for the transfusion of blood.

The National Blood Transfusion Service Unit based on Birmingham visits Oswestry twice yearly and a large number of faithful donors continue to respond but new volunteers are welcome to take the place of those reaching retiring age or leaving the district.

MEDICAL EXAMINATIONS

Apart from routine medical inspections which are carried out in schools and clinics, from time to time the Medical Officer of Health carries out

- (a) Pre-employment examinations of all entrants to Local Government service employed by Oswestry Rural District Council.
- (b) Examinations to ascertain the fitness of children (aged 13 years and over) to engage in part-time work outside school hours.

 The scope and duration of this employment is strictly controlled by law. (Children and Young Persons Act, 1933).
- (c) All entrants to the teaching profession.
- (d) The assessment of the fitness of various individuals to continue their present employment.

During the year it was resolved to extend the mains to serve several properties at Wernlas. This is an area close to Melverley where frequent flooding occurs and consequently pollution of local supplies.

Two exist in the country, one at Llanymymech and one on the Encecourse.

PUBLIC SEWERS

During the year the sewerage scheme at West Felton was completed as also was the extension of sewers at Penygarreg Lane, Pant, and the Wern, Weston Rhyn.

The new Works at Maesbury Road to serve the Rural Borough of Oswestry, Morda, Trefonen and Treflach is nearing completion.

REFUSE COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL

Refuse collection and disposal have been the subject of work study, which for several months caused chaos and many complaints from the public were received. It was found eventually that too much pruning of vehicles and labour had taken place. By the end of the year the scheme was starting to work more smoothly and the men settling down to the new routine.

STREET CLEANSING

Street cleansing is to be studied, but at the present time the employees and mechanical sweepers remain the same, namely, 4 men employed as manual sweepers and 2 men on mechanical sweepers.

PUBLIC CONVENIENCES

Three blocks of Conveniences exist in the town for ladies and gents.

Two exist in the country, one at Llanymynech and one on the Racecourse.

The attendants are to be congratulated on the high standard of cleanliness they maintain.

The toilets, both ladies and gents, situated in Beatrice Street are structurally unsatisfactory and should be replaced with modern conveniences.

PROVENTION OF DAMAGE BY PESTS

One man is permanently employed on treatment and inspection of premises. Being adjacent to a Warfarin Resistant area, close co-operation exists between the department and the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food. The scheme is working quite satisfactorily. We have not had evidence of warfarin resistant rats within the rural district.

Morda, Trefenen and Treflach is dearing completion.

PUBLIC BATHS

The high standard of cleanliness and of the water in the pool has been maintained during the year and the baths proved as popular as ever with people of all ages.

PLACES OF ENTERTAINMENT

The two Cinemas in the town received their annual inspection and a Certificate was issued regarding their cleanliness, ventilation and adequacy of facilities, a copy of which was submitted to the Magistrates.

LICENSING ACT, 1961

Registered Clubs in the area received their annual inspection. Conditions were entirely satisfactory.
