TO THE OUNDLE URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg to report on the Health of the Town during the year 1945 as follows:—

General Description.

The town stands at a level varying from 60 to 200 feet above sea-level.

It comprises an area of 2,075 acres, exclusive of that covered by water.

The Registrar-General's estimate of the resident population (mid-1945) is 2,413. This, I think, omits Oundle School boys.

There are 651 inhabited houses at the end of the year, according to the Rate Books.

The rateable value is £18,328.

A penny rate produces £74 8s. 7d.

The chief industries are a brewery and general shops. There are no factories.

There is also an important public school with some 600 resident boys, and two elementary schools.

Sanitary Circumstances.

Water.—There is an abundant supply of water, which is softened from 29 to 10 to 14 degrees of hardness.

Quarterly analyses have all been excellent.

Drainage and Sewerage.—Drains and sewers are efficient and well kept.

Sewage works are old-fashioned, but effective. Refuse is collected twice a week.

Public Lavatories.—There is a public lavatory for women in the Market Place.

Swimming Baths.—There is a bathing place in the river under the Council's direction and the Oundle School has a large open-air swimming bath.

Diphtheria Immunization.

This is done by the County Medical Officers and private practitioners.

It is estimated that 65 % of the children under 15 years of age have been immunized.

Prevention of Blindness.

No cases have occurred.

The town is clean and healthy; food, water and drainage are good, and roads are well kept.

ANNUAL REPORT OF WATERWORKS ENGINEER, SURVEYOR AND SANITARY INSPECTOR.

TO THE MEDICAL OFFICER OF HEALTH.

SIR,

I herewith submit my Report of work carried out for the year ended 31st December, 1945.

Public Water Supply.

A pure and constant Water Supply has been maintained throughout the year. The consumption is above normal.

Main Sewers.

The Main Sewers have been regularly inspected and flushed and are in order.

Sewage Outfall Works.

The Sewage Outfall Works have been well maintained.

Sewer Rodent Control.

As directed by the Ministry of Food, 90 % of the manholes were pre-baited. Total takes, 7. Poison baits were then laid. Only 3 complete baits were taken; no bodies were found.

Rat Week.

The Campaign against rats resulted in 31 actually killed. 327 poison baits were laid and nearly all baits were taken.

A Report of the results was sent to the Ministry of Food.

Food Inspection.

On request the undermentioned commodities were condemned as unfit for human consumption.

Clean Milk Production (Keeping Quality).

20 samples of Raw and T.T. Milk were taken during the year.

3 samples of T.T. Milk were designated Good.

1 sample of T.T. Milk was designated Moderate.

10 samples of Raw Milk were designated Good.

4 samples of Raw Milk were designated Moderate.

2 samples of Raw Milk were designated Bad.
