

Samples are regularly examined at the Public Health Laboratory Dorchester. The water supply is chlorinated at the source.

(3) Precautions taken against contamination of hydrants & hosepipes.

The Harbour Master is responsible for the cleanliness of the standpipes at the Harbour.

Officer is always prepared to give special facilities to Merchant Seamen. In-patient accommodation is provided for at the Westhaven Hospital, Radipole Lane, Weymouth. The Port Medical Officer gives the appropriate information to persons concerned regarding treatment facilities.
