

Mr. Chairman, Ladies and Gentlemen,

I have the honour to present my Annual Report on the Health and Environmental condition of the Urban District of Padiham, for the year ending 31st December, 1970. The layout follows the usual pattern and the contents include all the items requested by the Department of Health and Social Security.

According to the Registrar General's estimate, the population decreased by 60 compared to the previous year.

The birthrate continued to decrease, in accordance with national trends, and after adjustment for the age and sex of the population, the figure of 16.2 is very similar to that for England and Wales but lower than the County figure.

The death rate was also lower than the previous year and was the same as the figure for the County as a whole. Causes of death in 1970 show a generally satisfactory position, there being no deaths in the under 35 age groups other than accidental.

Notification of Infectious Diseases were high, but this was largely due to an outbreak of measles, and now that immunisation against this disease is freely available, it seems unlikely that such a high incidence will be seen again.

I would like to thank the Chairman and Members of the Health Committee for their interest and the staff of the Health Department for all the work they have put in during 1970.

Treatment is a function of the Manchester Regional Hospital Board, and enquiries or cases brought to our notice are directed to the clinic at Burnley.

ILLEGITIMATE CHILDREN

The Burnley and District House of Help act as agents for the County Council, and carry out all the necessary arrangements, combining efficiency with understanding.

LABORATORY WORK

This work is carried out at the Public Health Laboratory, Meadow Street, Preston as and when necessary.

The Lancashire County Council provides and maintains the following, with delegation to the No. 6 Divisional Health Committee, on which Padiham Urban District has representation.

AMBULANCE SERVICE The District is served by purpose-built County Ambulance Stations at Altham and Nelson, and there are five vehicles providing day and night cover. The average time taken to reach a patient, after receipt of an emergency call is approximately 8 minutes and to hospital, 25 minutes.

CHILD WELFARE SERVICE The Infant Welfare Centre and School Clinic for the Urban District is the New Clinic which is situated on Station Road.

MIDWIFERY SERVICE There are two District Midwives assigned to Padiham, who reside within the District, namely Miss R.M.S. Catterall and Mrs. S. H. Murphy.

HOME NURSING This service is in the capable hands of Sisters K.M.Cox and A. Goodwin and Nurse Gears.
