During the year 6 bodies have been placed in the mortuary.

Dock installations.

The sanitary facilities and canteens provided by Messrs. Harvey & Co., were visited and found clean and satisfactory.

The dock area is now disinfested against rats by the Health Dept. for Mossrs. Harvey & Co., on a recharge basis twice a year.

Both Messre. Harvey & Co., and the R.D.C. had erected notice boards around Copperhouse Dock prohibiting deposit of refuse.

The use of the old ressroom on North Quay was discontinued and the canteen taken over from the Associated Ethyl Co. was brought into use and is a great improvement.
