ANNUAL REPORT OF PORT MEDICAL OFFICER, PORT HEALTH
INSPECTOR FOR THE YEAR 1959.



To the Chairman and Members of the Port Health Committee.

Mr. Chairman and Gentlemen,

Herewith is my report for the year 1959 which is, as before, along the lines prescribed by the Ministry.

As far as Infectious diseases arising in the Port are concerned, a weekly Report is sent to the Registrar General, but as will be seen, no cases were reported.

On 12th March however a warning was sent to Pilots and Customs requesting immediate notice of any ship from the Mersey Ports where Smallpox had been diagnosed, but no shipping from that area arrived at Hayle and in due course, with the infection over, the alert was ended.

Arrangements were made during the year for an alternative outlet in a neighbouring Authority for cesspool emptier discharges when the tides in Hayle estuary were unfavourable and these arrangements are working satisfactorily.

The difficulties previously experienced with sewage disposal on the Fair Ground site are likely now to diminish with the provision by the site owners of a locked manhole having a direct connection to the Council's sewer.

As the result of my attention being drawn to possible offence resulting from dredging operations in the dock, the matter was investigated but no action was recommended.

A visit was made to the houseboat "Renaissance" moored near Lelant Station for use as dwelling accommodation. A piped water supply was laid on by St. Ives Corporation and sewage discharges were regulated to suitable states of the tide. No action was recommended.

One ship "M.V. Killbride" was found to have an invalid deratisation exemption certificate and arrangements were made with the Port Talbot Authority for this to be regularised when she docked. This was done.

The M.V. "Futurity" was found on inspection to have certain defects and the attention of the owners was drawn to these and subsequent correspondence showed that the works specified had been attended to but that the ship has now been withdrawn from service.

19 bodies were placed in the Mortuary during the year and no deficiencies were drawn to our attention by the County Pathologist.

Various local firms with buildings in the dock area are proposing alterations and buildings and I will keep you informed on developments as they occur.
