Herewith is my report for the year ending 31st December 1969.

New International Code of Signals came into operation in April where inter alia the signal for "I require Port Medical Officer" is replaced. The Hayle Harbour Master has been advised of this.

The current position regarding sewage disposal is that there has been a modification in the proposed works at Carnsew to accommodate sewage from Lelant on terms agreeable to both the two Councils. This will involve the laying of a pumping main across the estuary from the Saltings. Slow progress is being made on the scheme.

Seventeen bodies passed through the Mortuary during the year. There are no specific points which I have to bring to your attention.
