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

To Chairman and Members of the Port Health Committee

Mr. Chairman and Gentlemen,

Attached hereto is my report for the year ending 31st December 1970.

The current position regarding sewage disposal is that there have been further modifications designed to remove the sewage disposal works from the dock area, although the estuary will continue to be the outfall for the effluent.

The Public Health (Ships) Regulations 1970 which will become operative on 1st January 1971, do not differ to any appreciable extent from the existing regulations, and the nature of the business of Hayle Port demands little amendment at this stage.

Generally, the regulations are designed to prevent the spread of infection from a foreign port, infected home port, or ship, and includes the provision of powers of inspection, isolation and surveillance of ships and/or persons travelling in the ship and the deratting of infested vessels.

23 bodies passed through the Mortuary during the year.

There are no specific problems to which your attention should be drawn.
