The amount of Shipping entering the Port within your Jurisdiction during the year 1954 was as follows:-
British Steamers and Motor Vessels:-763, British Fishing Craft:-247, Of these 58 were inspected by the Medical Officer of Health or Deputy Medical Officer of Health, and 104 by the Sanitary Inspector.
Foreign Steamers or Motor Vessels:-49, Foreign Fishing Craft:-137, of these 53 were inspected by the Medical Officer of Health or Deputy Medical Officer of Health, and 14 by the Sanitary Inspector. All shipping inspected was found to be in a satisfactory sanitary condition, and no orders had to be made.
