Character of Shipping This consists mainly of Coastwise steamers or motor vessels. Only one passenger carrying ship used the Port - the R.M.S. "Scillonion" which runs regularly between Penzance and the Isles of Scilly. In addition a variable number of steamers (average 500 tons) from Foreign Ports, almost exclusively Northern European use the port of Newlyn to load crushed stone, French Dutch, Belgian and
