

Character of Shipping. This consists of Coastwise steamers and motor vessels at Penzance. There is one regular passenger and cargo ship the R.M.S. "Scillonian" which runs between Penzance and the Isles of Scilly. At Newlyn there is a regular traffic of steamers or motor vessels (average 500 tons) to and from Home and Foreign Ports (mostly Northern European) with cargoes of crushed stone. In addition British and Foreign trawlers land fish for the Newlyn Fish Market
