DRAINAGE & SEWERAGE

The following are the Sewage Disposal Works situated within the District:-

Bishampton. Sewage pumped to upward-flow sedimentation tank; settled effluent passing percolating filter and humus tank before being discharged to stream.

Bredon. Village sewered on 'combined' system. Sewage receives primary settlement and effluent is then discharged by feedchannels for land treatment.

Broughton Hackett. Small gravity works, with settlement tank, filter and humus tank.

Cropthorne. Crude sewage pumped to upward-flow sedimentation tank; settled effluent passing through percolating filter and humus tank before being discharged to river.

Defford. Gravity works with settlement and filtration.

<u>akes Broughton.</u>	Settled effluent pumped for filtration, followed by settlement of humus.

Work is progressing in the construction of the Sewage Disposal Works and the pumping stations at Lefford Road, Pershore and Wick. The laying of sewers is proceeding at Pinvin, Wick and Pershore, whilst the rising mains at Wyre and Pershore have been completed.



## REFUSE COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL.

Refuse Collection and disposal was carried out throughout the district under the direction of the Surveyor's Department. Fortnightly collections were given throughout the country districts and weekly collections in the Town of Pershore. Three refuse collection vehicles were in use during the year.

A contract for refuse collection was also undertaken with the R.R.E., Pershore.

Paper continued to be salvaged during the year, the revenue amounting to £685, compared with £708 during 1960. Scrap metal and other materials were also recovered.

There is still a pressing need for a further tipping area on which controlled tipping can be undertaken.
