REFUSE COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL.

Refuse Collection and disposal was carried out throughout the district under the direction of the Surveyor's Department. Fortnightly collections were given throughout the country districts and weekly collections in the Town of Pershore. Three refuse collection vehicles were in use during the year.

A contract for refuse collection was also undertaken with the R.R.E., Pershore.

Paper continued to be salvaged during the year, the revenue amounting to £685, compared with £708 during 1960. Scrap metal and other materials were also recovered.

SLAUGHTERHOUSES ACT, 1958.

During the year the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food confirmed the 1st. January, 1962 as the day from which all slaughterhouses in the Council's district must comply with the Constructional Regulations.

At the end of the year neither of the occupiers had completed the necessary improvements. The Slaughterhouse licences expired on the 31st. December, 1961 and same will not be renewed until the premises comply with the Constructional Regulations.
