*To the Chairman and Members of the Pickering Urban District Council.*

GENTLEMEN,

I have the honour to present to you my Report on the health and sanitary conditions of your Area.

### SECTION A. Statistics and Social Conditions of the Area.

The Area of your District is 15,625 acres.

The estimated resident Population is 3,944.

The number of inhabited houses is 1,198.

The Rateable Value is £15,190, which produces a Penny Rate, £60 : 16 : 0 nett.

#### *Social Conditions.*

The inhabitants of the District are mainly occupied in agricultural pursuits.

## **SECTION B. General Provision of Health Services for the Area.**

### **Public Health Officers of the Authority are :—**

The M.O.H., Sanitary Inspector, District Nurse and the School Medical Officer. The M.O.H. is in charge of the Child Welfare Clinic and is assisted by the District Nurse.

The total number of attendances at the Child Welfare Clinic, which meets on 2nd and 4th Thursdays of each month, was 195 under one year of age, and 388 between 1 and 5 years of age.

### **Nursing in the Homes.**

The District Nurse attends cases in the homes where necessary, except in infectious cases.

The Isolation Hospital Scheme is under consideration still, infectious cases being meantime nursed in the homes, or when conditions are unsuitable are sent to Scarborough Fever Hospital.

### **Laboratory Facilities.**

The North Riding Laboratory, Scarborough, undertakes all necessary work.

### **Hospitals.**

There is no change in former arrangements.

### **Ambulance Facilities.**

The Motor Ambulance continues to be of the greatest service to the community.

### **Clinics and Treatment Centres.**

No alteration has been made in former arrangements.

### **Shops and Offices.**

Improved Sanitary accommodation has been provided to 4 Shops including improved Ventilation and Lighting.



### **Public Cleansing.**

Little re-adjustment has been found necessary with the existing arrangements which are carried out by the Council's Motor Vehicle and direct labour. Very few complaints have been received and the system seems to work very satisfactorily.

### **Camping Sites.**

No Licenses have been issued.

### **Smoke Abatement.**

No action has been found necessary.

### **Swimming Baths and Pools.**

The Council's Swimming Bath previously used, mainly by school children, has not been used as the premises were required for other purposes.

### **Eradication of Bed Bugs.**

There have been no cases of bug infestation and occasional flea infested houses have been dealt with by spraying with insecticide and fumigating with sulphur.
