


- (1) Cases of smallpox are removed to the smallpox hospital at Crabucod, near Winohester.

- (2) Bacteriological or pathological examination of rodents can be carried out at the Central Laboratory, Infectious Diseases Hospital; none was examined during the year.
- (3) The Port is not approved for the deratting of ships and, by agreement with Southempton Port Health Authority, this is undertaken by them.

 One Deratting Certificate and nine Deratting Exemption Certificates were issued during the year.
- (4) When necessary, rat guards are placed on ropes between ships and quaya-


