Three samples are obtained by the Public Health Department each month, two from the adits of untreated water, and one from the mains of treated water, and these are submitted to the County Laboratories for bacteriological examination. In addition, one sample is submitted each quarter to the Public Analyst.

All results during 1952 showed that there was no evidence of sewage contamination.

(3) Precautions taken against contamination of hydrants and hosepipes.

Hoses used for shipping are stored in a closed barrow and flushed before use.

The Pegwell Bay (Shellfish) Regulations have been in operation since December 1925. These Regulations prohibit the sale of cookles taken from a prescribed area in Pegwell Bay until they have been subjected to sterilisation by steam under pressure for at least six minutes, the sterilisation must be carried out by the Local Authority or in a menner approved by the Medical Officer of Health.
