An Infant Welfare Centre has been established by the County Council within the Parish of Barlby, and Sessions are held fortnightly.

SECTION III.

SANITARY CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE DISTRICT. WATER SUPPLY.

A piped supply of water is provided in the Parishes of Barlby, Osgodby and Riccall. Of the 1,323 houses in the Rural District, 60% are connected to the public mains.

Parish of Kelfield.—No steps have yet been taken to provide this village with an adequate supply of water.

Parish of Cliffe.—The Council considered a scheme for the provision of a piped supply, but owing to the withdrawal of the grants from the Government it had to be abandoned.

No complaints have been received of shortage of water during the past year.
