



## TO THE CHAIRMAN AND MEMBERS

## River Blyth Port Sanitary Authority.

BLYTH, January, 1915.

GENTLEMEN,—I have the honour to present to you my Annual Report for the year ending December 31st, 1914.

During the year, 2562 vessels other than fishing boats arrived in the port. A systematic and careful inspection of all vessels was made on their arrival, and no case of Infectious Disease came under my notice. The weekly returns of the Local Government Board sent me are most helpful in this respect.

The trade of the port is practically the same as in former years, viz.:—The export of coal and the import of wood, which is mainly used for pit purposes. For the first seven months of the year the export of coal showed a slight increase as compared with last year, but with the outbreak of war in August, from then till the end of December, the export of coal fell to almost one half less than in the corresponding months of last year, with the result that the total tonnage of coal exported for 1914 was almost one million tons less than 1913.

The work at the new staiths in the upper reaches of the river is steadily progressing.

During the year the imports of foodstuffs were practically nil, and in no case was it necessary to take action under The Public Health (Regulation of Food) Act, 1907.

The herring fishing came to an early termination in August, owing to the Naval Authorities declaring the North Sea a war zone, only 562 trawlers and drifters using the port in 1914, as against 4788 entries in 1913.

WATER SUPPLY—The water-boats were inspected and found satisfactory. The majority of the vessels are supplied by the Blyth and Bedlington Urban District Councils.

The number of vessels from suspected ports was 3 but no infectious disease was found amongst the crews.

I made 24 special visits to ships in the harbour, but no trace of infectious disease was found.

I desire to express my thanks to Mr. Harris, Sanitary Inspector, and the staff at the Hospital.




