The Health Visitor paid 137 visits of enquiry to the homes of notified cases of tuberculosis and arranged for examination of contacts by the Chest Physician; and reported on home conditions. She also attends the chest clinics at Melton Mowbray and Stamford Hospitals for case consultations with the Chest Physicians on matters affecting the patients' families. Cases considered to be inadequately housed are referred by the Health Committee to the Local Sanitary Authority with a recommendation for re-housing where possible.

HOME HEALTH SERVICES

The Health Visitors follow up all cases discharged from Hospital if asked to visit - mainly from Maternity Units.

There are no arrangements for Health Visitors to work in conjunction with General Practitioners. The home nurse/midwives however work harmoniously with the doctors in their districts.

Health Education

Although no Health Education Officer is employed every effort is made, through the exhibition of posters and direct contact between the Health Department staff and the general public, to promote health education.

Material for display is distributed to infant welfare centres, schools, the School Dental Service and the Schools Meals Service.

During the Year the Dental Officer held a competition for a poster on Dental Health and arranged for a Mobile Dental Exhibition to be in attendance at the Annual Show of the Rutland Agricultural Society.

Smoking and Health

Following the publication of the Report by the Royal College of Physicians on Smoking and Health regarding ways and means by which a publicity campaign on this subject might be promoted it was decided to take advantage of the Central Council for Health Education's offer to place at the disposal of local authorities a Mobile Unit. Arrangements were made for one of the Mobile Units to visit the County on 9th, 10th and 11th October, to give lectures and show films on "Smoking and Health". Visits were paid by this Unit to secondary and primary schools, Uppingham Public School, two factories, a Rotary Club meeting and two parent teacher associations.

Mental Health Services

Further developments in the Mental Health Services are included in the Council's 10 year plan.

The after care of mental health cases discharged from the Hospitals continues to be undertaken by the Mental Welfare Officer who visits them when requested to do so by the Hospital, and he is usually successful in obtaining remunerative employment for them.

CHIROPODY SERVICE

(N.H.S. Act Section 28)

This service continues to expand and another clinic was opened at Ryhall in October 1962 with Miss Farndell in attendance.

The secretaries and other voluntary helpers at the Old People's Clubs again gave valuable help in running the Chiropody Clinics.

The increase in mileage over last year was just over 1% and this can be considered as reasonable compared with the national average of approximately 2%. Again there was an increase in the number of patients carried other than Section 27 cases, i.e. mentally disordered, mentally sub-normal and for the school health service patients to the speech therapy, refraction and dental clinics.

Equipment

Another Stephenson Minuteman resuscitator was purchased during the year and was used on a number of occasions.

Training

All the drivers attended First Aid and Civil Defence classes during the year. Following the publication of the Ministry of Health's Standing Medical Advisory Committee's Report on Accident and Emergency Services advanced training for the drivers was approved by the Health Committee.

Radio Control

The control of the ambulance service by radio telephone became operative on 14th September 1962 and its effects can be seen by comparing the mileage covered by ambulances and cars over the last few months of the year. The transmitter, situated on the G.P.O. site on Cold Overton Hill, Oakham, is remotely controlled from the Health Department. Calls from vehicles are heard initially on a loud-speaker on a telephone handset, this loudspeaker cuts out immediately the telephone is lifted and operated as any G.P.O. telephone. Each ambulance driver reports on leaving and returning to Oakham (his home or the Depot), and on arriving at or leaving a hospital. Signals have been loud and clear on all normal routes taken by the ambulances.
