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

The conditions of occupation and of environment have not had a prejudicial influence on the general health or mortality. Salcombe is well-known as a holiday resort and yachting centre.
During the summer months - June to September - the population is practically doubled by the influx of visitors.

GENERAL PROVISION OF HEALTH SERVICES FOR THE AREA

The Public Health Officers of the Authority are a Medical Officer of Health (also Medical Officer of Hoalth of the Plympton Rural and Kingsbridge Rural and Urban Districts.

Deputy Medical Officer of Health (occasional).
One full-time Surveyor and Public Health Inspector.

LABORATORY FACILITIES

The Public Health Laboratory Service provide a service at the South Devon and East Cornwall Hospital, Plymouth, for the investigation of communicable disease, and the examination of milk, water supplies, ice-cream and foodstuffs etc.

This Laboratory is of great assistance, and I am grateful for

their willing co-operation at all times.

VACCINATION AND IMMUNISATION are carried out through the General Practitioner Service or at Schools, School Clinics and Infant Welfare Centres by the County Council through the County Health Services. Supplies of Diphtheria Antigen can be obtained from The County Medical Officer, 45, St. David's Hill, Exeter, and Vaccine Lymph from the Public Health Laboratory Service, 7, Dix's Field, Exeter.

THE SOUTH HAMS COTTAGE HOSPITAL provide 16 beds for patients from Kingsbridge and the surrounding districts -

Men's Ward ... 6 beds Women's Ward ... 6 beds children's Cots 2 Private Wards 2 (1 bcd each)

ISOLATION HOSPITAL

Cases of Infectious Disease are sent to the Scott Isolation Hospital. Patients are removed by the Plymouth Ambulance Service on behalf of the Devon County Council.

MIDWIVES

The Midwives Act is administered by the County Council which investigates cases of Maternal Mortality and Puerperal Disease. There is one practising Midwife in the District.

MATERNITY AND CHILD WELFARE CENTRE

There is a centre in Salcombe which is open on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays in each month.

VENEREAL DISEASES TREATMENT

At the Venereal Diseases Department, City Hospital, Plymouth. Female in-patients are also sent to St. Mary's Home, Exeter. Female in refund of rail or 'bus fare can be made in suitable cases by applying to the Medical Officer of the Centre or to The County Medical Officer.

Treatment is also available from a certain number of selected General Medical Practitioners specially approved for the purpose by the Ministry of Health. There is one such Practitioner in Modbury and another at Kingsbridge.

X-RAYS

The Regional Hospital Board have apparatus for examinations at their Chest Clinics at Exeter, Torquay, Barnstaple and Plymouth.

OPEN-AIR SCHOOL

The Devon County Council maintain a residential home for the rehabilitation of delicate and debilitated children at Ocklands Park, Dawlish. There is also an Open-Air School for delicate children at Torquay.

ORTHOPAEDIC TREATMENT is available through the Devon Orthopaedic Association as in-patients at Exeter and Plymouth. For out-patients there is a Clinic at Kingsbridge and the South West Clinic, which deals with this district as well, is held at Hartley House, Mannamead, Plymouth.

AMBULANCE SERVICES

The Ambulance Service throughout Dovon is operated in accordance with Section 27(2) of the National Health Service Act. 1945, through the agency of the Voluntary Organisations. Infectious cases in the Plymouth Infectious Area are carried, by agreement, in the Plymouth Infectious Ambulance.

SANITARY CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE AREA.

WATER SUPPLY

The source of the water for the district is at South Brent, and the supply and distribution continues to be maintained by the South Devon Water Board, being satisfactory in quality and quantity. A total of nine samples were periodically taken with satisfactory result.

PUBLIC CLEANSING

A weekly collection of refuse in all parts of the district has been carried out.

FOOD INSPECTIONS

The following foodstuffs were condemned as being unfit for human consumption:-

8 tins of meat and 168 lbs of meat.

Assistance has been given regularly to earry out meat inspection duties in the Kingsbridge Rural District Area.

BAKEHOUSES

The 3 bakehouses were inspected and were kept in a satisfactory condition.

ICE-CREAM

Samples of ice-cream were taken - all satisfactory.

SCHOOLS CARRY

There are 3 schools in the district.

During the year, 4 notices were received referring to 28 children who were excluded from school because of communicable disease or because they were contacts.

DISINFECTION

Routine disinfection has been carried out after all notified cases of infectious disease.

NUIS NCES

14 complaints of nuisances were received, all of which were dealt with by informal action.
