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

GENERAL PROVISION OF HEALTH SERVICES FOR THE AREA

The personal health services are provided by various bodies, by far the greater part being under the control of the Regional Hospital Board, Devon County Council and the Local Executive Council.

The Public Health Laboratory Service has a laboratory in Plymouth for the investigation of communicable diseases and the examination of milk, water, ice-cream, foodstuffs, etc.

The Devon County Health Handbook gives details of the health and allied social services in the County of Devon. Much of its information refers to the County as a whole, but there are details of the various services provided in this district.

SANITARY CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE AREA

WATER SUPPLY

This is maintained by the South Devon Water Board and the quantity and quality are both satisfactory.

SEWERAGE

During the year Tenders were invited the construction of the new trunk sewer and partial treatment works. Phase were found to be higher than expected and in view of the site difficulties an alternative site for the construction of holding tanks was considered. This has now been approved and an amended scheme is being prepared. It is imperative to proceed with the new sewer and tanks without delay so as to improve the highly unsatisfactory conditions of the foreshore and parts of the estuary.

PUBLIC CLEANSING

Refuse is collected weekly from all parts of the district, more frequent collection being given to hotels and catering premises, and disposed of by means of controlled tipping at Batson Creek.

FOOD INSPECTIONS

The following foodstuffs were voluntarily surrendered as being found unfit for human consumption:25 lbs. 12 oza Mixed Tinned Foods

ICE-CREAM

Five samples of ice-cream were taken.

BAKEHOUSES

There is one bakehouse within the district and no complaints have been received.

SCHOOLS

There are four Schools in the district.

NUISANCES

All complaints received were dealt with informally.

CAMPING SITES

The control of camping within the Urban District occupies a considerable amount of time of the Health Department during the summer months. Two sites are licenced within the district for caravans and tents and regular visits are paid to these and to other small sites. Most of the Urban District is covered by an Article 4 Direction under the Town and Country Planning Act which controls indiscriminate camping. Arrangements have been made for the larger of the two camping sites to be closed at the end of October 1965 but alternative arrangements have been made in the surrounding district.
