SCARBOROUGH RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

To the Chairman and Members of the Scarborough Rural
District Council.

Gentlemen,

I beg to submit the statistical data for the year ending 31st December, 1940.

The estimated population in the middle of the year was 7,362.

BIRTHS. 47 male and 49 female children were born - giving a birth-rate of 11.8. For England and Wales it was 14.6.

DEATHS. There were 47 males and 49 females died giving a death rate of 13.04. For the whole country it was 14.3.
Infantile deaths 4; infantile death rate 45.9 per 1000 against 55 for England and Wales.

The chief CAUSES of DEATH were:-

INFECTIOUS DISEASES. No deaths from infectious diseases except 2 from tubercle.

Cancer - 16; Influenza - 2; Heart - 16; other diseases of the circulatory system 3; Bronchitis - 8; Pneumonia - 3; Road accident - 1; other forms of Violence - 5; all other causes - 38.

CASES of INFECTIOUS DISEASE NOTIFIED:-

Enteric fever - 1; Scarlet fever - 3;
Whooping Cough - 1; Erysipelas - 1;
Measles - 17; Pneumonia - 3
