

A Disinfestation Centre for the treatment of Scabies has been established by the County Council at their Welfare Institution in Selby.

Sessions are held on Tuesdays at 2 p.m.

85 persons received treatment during the year.

WATER SUPPLY.

The Water Supply of the District is obtained from the works of the Selby Urban District Council. The water is chlorinated, the supply constant, and 98% of the houses are connected to the public mains.

98% of the population is supplied with the water.

During the war, water main extensions have been made to a Military Camp and an Aerodrome in the area.

The Council has under consideration a small scheme for the extension of the water main to properties in the Parishes of Barlow, Carlton, Chapel Haddlesey and Hambleton.
