## BIRTHS AND BIRTH RATE.

151 births—15 males and 76 females—were registered, furnishing a birth rate of 14.9 per 1,000, compared with a rate of 17.1 for the previous year.

The rate for England and Wales is 14.4 per 1,000.

One birth was illegitimate.

## DEATHS AND DEATH RATE.

110 deaths—56 males and 54 females—were registered, furnishing a death rate of 10.8 per 1,000 population, being 1.1 per 1,000 less than the rate for the previous year.

The rate for England and Wales is 12.3 per 1,000.

125 (gross) deaths occurred during the year, and of these 32% occurred in Institutions.

Of the nett deaths 22% took place in Institutions.

The work in connection with the first year's programme is now proceeding.

The Medical Officer of Health must impress upon the Council the necessity for dealing with those houses which would appear to fall within the terms of Section 17, H.A., 1930, *e.g.*, they are capable of being rendered in all respects fit for human habitation at a reasonable cost. At the same time it should be realized that even some of these houses, as the result of a careful survey, may be found to come within the ambit of Section 19 H.A., 1930—*i.e.*, They cannot be made fit at a reasonable cost.
