GENERAL PROVISION OF HEALTH SERVICES FOR THE AREA

Fever and Smallpox cases are sent to the Joint Hospital, Clifton. Tuberculosis: There are several sanatoria available and within easy reach of district; e.g., Sheffield, Keighley and Ilkley. Maternity cases can be attended at the Halifax Infirmary, (special wing); while children and other cases are also treated there. Ambulance facilities for infectious diseases are provided by the Brighouse Joint Hospital. Ambulances for non-infectious and accident cases can be requisitioned from either Halifax or Brighouse.

There is no Child Welfare or School Clinic in the district.

The Tuberculosis Dispensary is at Brighouse, The centre for Venereal Diseases is the Halifax Royal Infirmary.

PUBLIC HEALTH OFFICERS

The Medical Officer of Health and Sanitary Inspector, are the only two health officers paid by the Local Authority, and both appointments are part-time.

NURSING

There is no Local Nursing Institution, There is no Qualified Midwife in the district.

SANITATION

The water supply of the district is from Halifax and is adequate. No necessity for examination during the year.

The Scavenging of the district is satisfactory.

The sanitary conditions and water supply of the Schools are satisfactory.
