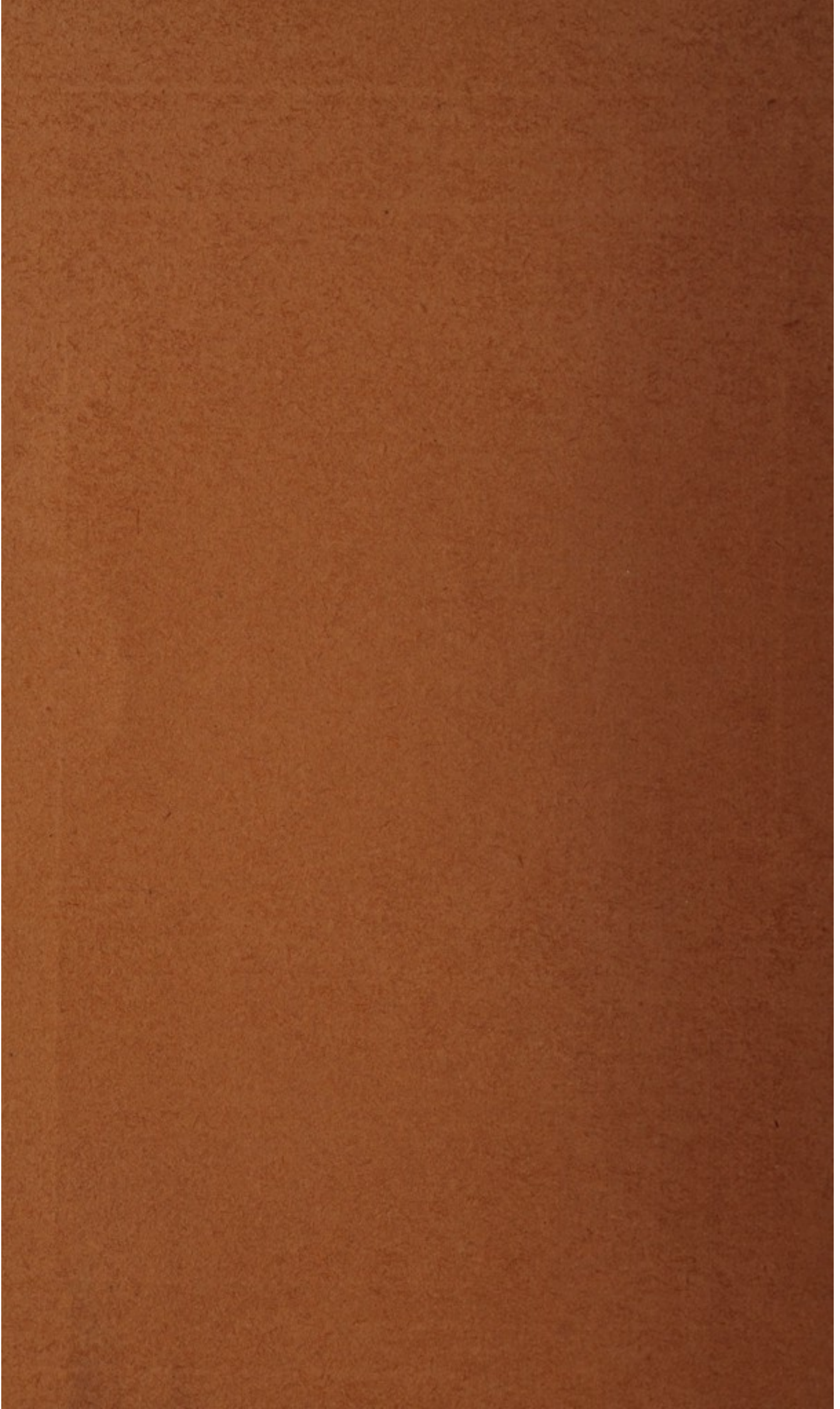

Staff.

Mr. F. Tero, Assistant Sanitary Inspector, has been serving with the Royal Army Medical Corps (Field Hygiene Section) since September, 1940, and is now on active service.

Closet Accommodation.

During the year one pail closet and five vault closets have been converted to the water carriage system, and the drainage of five premises previously discharging direct into the River Welland have been connected to the public sewer.

Public Cleansing.

The collection of house refuse is carried out on modern lines by mechanical low-loading vehicles and disposal is by means of Front Feed Refuse Destructor.

The salvage of materials required by industry for the war effort is carried out energetically, and the sale of this salvaged material realised £2,115 for the year.

Eradication of Bed Bugs.

During the year nine premises have been treated with "Zaldecide" for the eradication of Bed Bugs.

MEAT INSPECTION, 1942.

The details of condemnations are compiled from figures supplied by Mr. S. Sharman up to 31st September, 1942, and for the last three months of the year from my own monthly reports to the Public Health Committee. Total number of animals slaughtered has been extracted from the slaughter-house records.

Total number of animals slaughtered during the year 1942 at the Central Slaughter-house, New Bond Street, Spalding :

1,024 Cattle, 56 Calves, 4,095 Sheep, and 578 Pigs.
