#### APPENDIX C.

#### SPALDING U.D.C. WATERWORKS DEPARTMENT.

#### Water Supply.

An uninterrupted supply of water was maintained throughout the area during the year. The total quantity of water supplied to the Spalding U.D.C. area was 501,000,000 gallons of which 146,000,000 gallons was on metered supplies and 355,000,000 gallons on domestic and other unmeasured supplies.

The average consumption per head per day on domestic and unmeasured supplies was 61 gallons.

In addition to the water supplied to the Spalding U.D.C. area a total quantity of 284,000,000 gallons was supplied in bulk to neighbouring authorities.

2,070 yards of 3", 4" and 6" mains and 36 new services were laid during the year.

A new 36" bore was put down at Bourne Pumping Station during the year and was found on test to have a yield of 4,000,000 gallons per day.

The water from all three bores at Bourne continues to be of the highest standard of chemical and bacteriological purity but a nominal dose of chlorine is added to the water by the chloramine process as a precautionary measure.

A recent typical analysis of the water is attached hereto.

#### MEAT INSPECTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1946.

During the year under review all home killed meat, distributed in the Spalding Urban District, has been inspected, animals showing evidence of disease have been examined in detail and the necessary action taken to safe-guard the public health.

In order to facilitate the operation of the meat distribution scheme the Ministry of Food Officials have again taken advantage of the fact that the meat inspection work is under one inspector and extended their scheme of centralised slaughtering so that practically the whole of the slaughtering previously carried out at New Bond Street Slaughterhouse is now done at the Mill Green premises. The numbers of inspections and weight of condemnations given below are, therefore, rather high but the proportions applicable to the Spalding Urban District are substantially the same as in previous years.

2,269 cattle; 5,834 sheep; 448 pigs and 419 calves have been slaughtered and the following amount of meat and offals, having an approximate weight of 35 tons 1 cwt., has been condemned as unfit for human consumption and disposed of for other purposes under the Ministry of Food Waste Utilisation Scheme.
