## To the Chairman and Members of the St. Albans Rural District Council.

GENTLEMEN,

I have the honour to present to you my report for the past year, as Medical Officer of Health for the District over which you preside.

#### I.—AREA AND POPULATION.

The total area of the District comprises 37,981 acres, having a population, according to the census of 1901, of 12,264 persons, and estimated up to the end of 1906 as 13,603 persons, distributed amongst seven "parishes" or "localities," as indicated in the following tables.

For the purposes of this report, the population of each "locality" is estimated by deducting the deaths from the births during the year 1906, and adding the difference to the estimated population for the year 1905.

The average number of persons per acre is 35.

The number of inhabited houses in the District is 3,570, which, with a population of 13,603, gives the average number of persons per house as 3.8.

In the year 1905 the number of inhabited houses in the District was 3,392.

The natural increase during the year has been 220 births over deaths, as shown in the following table:—

In the year 1905 the excess of births over deaths was 193.

#### II.-VITAL STATISTICS.

The total number of Births registered in the District during the year was 423, composed of 211 males and 212 females. This gives a birth rate of 31 per 1000 population.

The Birth rate for the year 1905 was  $28 \cdot 2$ .

The number of Deaths registered in the District during the year was 339.

One hundred and sixty-three non-residents were registered as having died in the District, 55 of which took place at the Hertfordshire County Asylum and 110 at the Middlesex County Asylum. Twenty-six residents were registered as having died outside the District, 9 of which took place at the St. Albans Hospital, 16 at the St. Albans Union Infirmary, and 1 at the West Herts Infirmary.

Deducting, therefore, the 163 and adding the 26, we get the total number of deaths belonging to the District as 202.

This gives the true Death rate for the District as 14.8.

The Death rate in this District for the year 1905 was 13.8.

The number of Deaths of infants under one year of age was 56, which gives a Death rate of 134.7 per 1000 births registered.

Passing on to a detailed statement as to each locality, I have to report as follows:---

#### HARPENDEN RURAL.

Area in acres, 3453. Population, 368. Average number of persons per acre, 1. Number of inhabited houses, 76. Average number of persons per house, 4.8. Births, m. 4, f. 1, total 5. Deaths, 2, giving rate per 1000 population as 13.5 for the former and 5.4 for the latter. Deaths under 1 year of age, 1.

One case of Erysipelas was notified to me during the year.

The number of cowsheds and dairies registered is 0.

#### REDBOURN.

Area in acres, 4260. Population, 2044. Average number of persons per acre, ·48. Number of inhabited houses, 502. Average number of persons per house, 4·07. Births, m. 33, f. 24, total 57. Deaths, 37, giving rate per 1000 population of 27·8 for the former, and 18·1 for the latter. Deaths under 1 year of age, 6.

Five cases of Infectious Diseases were notified to me during the year, all of which were Erysipelas.

The number of dairies and cowsheds registered is 3.

#### ST. MICHAELS RURAL.

Area in acres, 6079. Population, 830. Average number of persons per acre, ·13. Number of inhabited houses, 189. Average number of persons per house, 4·3. Births, m. 8, f. 9, total 17. Deaths, 5; giving rate per 1000 population of 19·2 for the former and 6 for the latter. Deaths under 1 year of age, 0.

No cases of Infectious Diseases were notified to me during the year.

The number of dairies and cowsheds registered is 5.

#### ST. PETERS RURAL.

Area in acres, 5976. Population, 4311. Average number of persons per acre, 73. Number of inhabited houses, 1275. Average number of persons per house, 3.38. Births, m. 79, f. 83, total 162. Deaths, 60; giving rate per 1000 population of 37.5 for the former and 13.9 for the latter. Deaths under 1 year of age, 22.

Twenty-six cases of Infectious Diseases were notified to me during the year: 17 of Scarlet Fever, 4 of Diphtheria, 2 of Erysipelas, and 3 of Enteric.

One of the Enteric cases was notified from the Hertfordshire County Asylum, and two from the Middlesex County Asylum. Of these latter cases one was undoubtedly imported. It is difficult to assign a cause for the others, but as there have been no cases in any other part of the District, I suggest as a possible cause, infection from food brought by visitors to the patients.

The number of dairies and cowsheds registered is 10.

#### Camp Ward.

Since my last report, sewers have been laid in the following roads:—Harlesden, Burnham, Sandfield, Glenferrie and Brampton, and an order has been issued by the Local Government Board conferring on the Council the powers of the Private Streets Works Act 1892, with respect to these roads. Contracts have been entered into for making up all but one of these roads, and the work is proceeding.

#### London Colney Ward.

Thirty-three out of a total of 37 Wells in London Colney have been analysed, of which 14 were good and 19 bad.

Water from the company's mains has been laid on to most of the houses with defective Wells, and in other cases satisfactory arrangements have been made for occupiers to obtain good water from a near neighbour.

#### ST. STEPHENS.

Area in acres, 7438. Population, 1876. Average number of persons per acre, 25. Number of inhabited houses, 446. Average number of persons per house, 4.2. Births, m. 25, f. 25, total 50. Deaths, 23; giving rate per 1000 population of 26.6 for the former and 12.2 for the latter. Deaths under 1 year of age, 4.

Eight cases of Infectious Diseases were notified to me during the year: 5 of Scarlet Fever and 3 of Diphtheria.

On account of Measles the Public Elementary Schools at Park Street (Frogmore) and Colney Street (Frogmore), were closed from July 19th to August 2nd inclusive. Also on account of Measles the Public Elementary School at Colney Street was closed from December 10th to 15th inclusive.

The number of dairies and cowsheds registered is 10.

#### SANDRIDGE RURAL.

Area in acres, 5635. Population, 1596. Average number of persons per acre, ·28. Number of inhabited houses, 414. Average number of persons per house, 3·8. Births, m. 27, f. 31, total 58. Deaths, 22; giving rate per 1000 population of 36·02 for the former and 14·4 for the latter. Deaths under 1 year of age, 7.

One case of Infectious Disease of Scarlet Fever was notified to me during the year.

The number of dairies and cowsheds registered is 4.

#### WHEATHAMPSTEAD.

Area in acres, 5140. Population, 2578. Average number of persons per acre, .5. Number of inhabited houses, 668. Average number of persons per house, 3.8. Births, m. 35, f. 39, total 74. Deaths, 53; giving rate per 1000 population of 28.7 for the former and 20.5 for the latter. Deaths under 1 year of age, 16. On account of an outbreak of Measles the Public Elementary Schools at Gustard Wood were closed from November 12th to 23rd inclusive and those at Wheathampstead from December 10th to 24th inclusive.

The number of dairies and cowsheds registered is 9.

The defective sewer in Wheathampstead is now under process of being re-laid.

#### PREVENTIVE MEASURES.

The Sisters' Hospital, which we share with the Urban Authorities of St. Albans and Harpenden, has provided ample accommodation for all the Scarlet Fever cases.

We are still without any accommodation for Small Pox, Diphtheria, or Typhoid Fever.

Land has been purchased by the St. Albans Council, at Crouch Hall, near Redbourn, as a site for a Small Pox Hospital, and another site adjoining the Sisters' Hospital for a Typhoid and Diphtheria Hospital. An agreement to work joint hospitals on these sites has been drawn up and signed by this Council in conjunction with the St. Albans Council and Harpenden Council, and the Councils are now conferring as to the accommodation to be provided.

Bye-laws, Regulations and Adoptive Acts.

The Infectious Diseases (Prevention) Act of 1890 has been adopted during the year.

NEW STREETS AND BUILDINGS.

The present bye-laws in force are new and up-to-date, but it is felt by this Council that less stringent bye-laws are needed to be applied only to truly rural parts of the district. The matter is under consideration.

#### SLAUGHTER HOUSES.

Slaughter houses in this district are now registered.

DAIRIES, COWSHEDS AND MILKSHOPS.

There is a register of the dairies, cowsheds and milkshops in the district, which is kept up-to-date, and regular visits are paid by the Veterinary Inspector and Inspector of Nuisances.

#### NUISANCES.

Regulations as to offensive trades, slaughter houses, and nuisances, are in force in this district.

#### MORTUARY.

This Council has made arrangement with the Urban Authority of St. Albans, to use their mortuary when required.

#### FACTORIES AND WORKSHOPS.

There are 87 Factories and Workshops registered in the district. Of these, 21 are Factories and 66 are Workshops, distributed in the different parishes or localities as follows:—

N.B.- Under the heading of Carpenters are included Cabinet Makers, Upholsterers, Undertakers, Wheelwrights and Coachbuilders.

There is no overcrowding in any Workshop in the district, nearly all provide 500 c. f. air space, and many provide much more.

There are no wholesale Bakehouses in the district.

Under the Factories and Workshops Act, 1901, no underground Bakehouse must be used after January 1st, 1904, without written permission of the Sanitary Authorities. There is only one such underground Bakehouse in the district, which is in Wheathampstead parish, and this has received the necessary permission of this Council.

All limewashed Bakehouses have been re-limewashed twice during the year, and all are in a satisfactory condition.

There are 5 Factories and Workshops in this district which employ more than 40 persons.

They are situated as follows :---

St. Peters, 3 Factories.Sandridge, 1 Factory.Redbourn, 1 Factory.Redbourn, 1 Workshop.

These all have adequate means of escape from fire.

There are no outworkers of the specified classes in this district.

My thanks are due to the Inspector and other officers of this Council for their valuable assistance, and to you gentlemen for the very courteous way in which you have always treated me.


