Diphtheria Immunisation.

During 1944, 214 children were immunised against Diphtheria. 198 of these children were under school age and 16 between the ages of 5 and 15 years

Sanitary Administration.

Disinfection and Disinfestation.

Fifty rooms were disinfected following cases of infectious diseases. Six rooms were treated for the eradication of bed-bugs. Two large wards at a local hospital were disinfected following an outbreak of dysentry.

Nuisances.

One hundred and fifty-two complaints were satisfactorily dealt with by informal action. In one other case it was found necessary to serve an abatement notice.

Moveable Dwellings.

At the end of the year thirteen licences were in force authorising the use of certain sites in the district for moveable dwellings.

There is little doubt that the use of the powers available under Section 269 of the Public Health Act, 1936, continues to have good effect in discouraging an influx of these habitations, but constant vigilance and action is necessary.

Throughout the year we co-operated in the work connected with the National Milk Testing and Advisory Scheme by taking samples from producer-retailers. In all sixty-five samples were submitted to the Laboratory at Winches Farm, Hatfield Road, St. Albans.

Water.

The low rainfull over a rather long period led to a water shortage in those parts of the district which rely on wells. At Folly Fields, Amwell and Nomansland in the Parish of Wheathampstead, at Old Bricket Wood in the Parish of St. Stephen's and at isolated premises in the Parishes of Redbourn and Kinsbourne Green very considerable inconvenience was experienced. It is hoped that the main will shortly be extended into Folly Fields, Wheathampstead. The question of the provision of a piped supply to Amwell, Nomansland and Old Bricket Wood will no doubt receive full consideration immediately after the war.

Seventy-three per cent of the dwelling-houses in the area are supplied from waterworks. Of these 97½% are supplied from the works directly to the houses and the

remaining $2\frac{1}{2}\%$ by means of standpipes. This supply is constant in every case, the quality of the waters is satisfactory and there is no evidence that they are liable to have plumbo-solvent action.

Of the dwelling-houses served from waterworks, those in the Parish of Redbourn are supplied from the Council's own works. The remaining parishes are supplied by the following water undertakers:—the Harpenden Water Co., Ltd., the St. Albans Waterworks Co., the Barnet District Gas & Water Co., the Colne Valley Water Co., and the Borough of Hemel Hempstead. In addition there are one or two small private suppliers.

Meat Inspection.

During the year 11,763 animals were slaughtered by the Ministry of Food at the Government Slaughterhouse, Sandridge. Details are as follows:—
