SUMMARY OF NURSING ARRANGEMENTS.

General Nursing in the home is mainly undertaken
by the Nursing Home. In addition to this there are
several nurses in the Borough working independently.

MIDWIVES. There are 5 midwives working in the
Borough. No subsidised provision is made for this work.

CLINICS AND TREATMENT CENTRES.

A SCHOOL CLINIC for minor ailments is held every Wednesday morning. This Clinic is administered by the County Council. During 1923 the Clinic was open on 42 occasions, and 287 attendances were made.

MATERNITY AND CHILD WELFARE CENTRE.

This centre is held weekly on Wednesday afternoons. It is administered by the County Council. The Centre was open 43 times, and the total attendances were:—

705 mothers; 835 children; and 69 expectant mothers.

THE TUBERCULOSIS DISPENSARY, attended by the Assistant Tuberculosis Officers, is open every Friday afternoon.

HOSPITALS.

(1) Tuberculosis. Apart from open-air balconies at Stratford-on-Avon Union Workhouse there is no institutional provision locally.

(2) Maternity. None provided or subsidised by L.A.

3) Children. The Stratford-on-Avon Nursing Home receives children under the age when they are accepted by the General Hospital, but it is not provided or subsidised by L.A.

(4) Fever. (5) Smallpox. (6) Others. The Borough, jointly with adjoining Rural Districts, provides accommodation for all zymotic disease where removal to isolation is necessary and practicable. Smallpox is provided for in an isolated iron building of 8 bed capacity.

Institutional provision for unmarried mothers, illegitimate infants, and homeless children, apart from Poor Law arrangements, is not existant in the district.

AMBULANCE FACILITIES.

(a) For Infectious Cases. The Committee of the Joint (Infectious) Hospital in the district have replaced a horse-drawn ambulance by a motor,

(b) The General Hospital in the district removes non-infectious and accident cases by motor ambulance, the driver and stretcher bearers acting in a voluntary capacity.

LABORATORY WORK.

All pathological and bacteriological specimens have been examined at the Laboratory of the University of Birmingham.

Diphtheria Antitoxin is supplied from the Joint Hospital on application by medical practitioners.

SANITARY ADMINISTRATION.

SEWERAGE.

A much needed scheme has been carried out in the sewerage of Shottery and of Evesham Road. The sewerage of Shipston Road is at present under consideration and it will be necessary in the near future to extend the sewer in Birmingham Road.

A considerable amount of drainage work has been carried out in connection with the sewerage of Shottery and of the Evesham Road.

The drainage of 83 premises has been overhauled and connected to the main sewer. 46 of these premises had entirely new drains laid, the remainder being repaired. This work has resulted in 33 cesspools being dispensed with.

In connection with the Shottery Sewage Scheme the following alterations have been carried out :—

In the Shottery schools 3 privy closets have been replaced by a range of 5 new glazed earthenware trough closets.

In the Alcester Road Schools new glazed earthenware closets have been installed to replace cast iron troughs which had become very insanitary.

SCAVENGING.

Considerable attention has been given to the possibility of expediting this work, but alterations of the present arrangements have been deferred until the inclusion in the Borough of the Parish of Alveston.

3289 loads of house refuse have been removed to the Tip in Arden Street. A man is regularly employed at the Tip to keep it in order, and to utilize all material deposited by private persons, which is suitable for covering up the refuse.

71 dustbins have been provided as a result of 61 notices served.

SLAUGHTER HOUSES.

There are six private Slaughter Houses, 1 licensed and five registered. The Sanitary Inspector has submitted a report on these premises for your consideration, and has recommended the provision of more and better accommodation.

DAIRIES AND COWSHEDS.

There are 26 persons on the register, 19 as retail purveyors, 5 as producers only, and 2 as retail purveyors and producers. Seven are resident outside but carry on their business within the Borough.

One old cowshed has been brought into use, and two sheds have gone out of use, leaving a total of 9 sheds at present occupied. Improvements have been carried out to the lighting, ventilation, floors and drainage at 2 sheds (the one newly occupied and one which has changed hands).

Attention has had to be called to the dirty condition of the approach to two Cowsheds, and has resulted in improvement.

Complaint also had to be made of the keeping of swine in a cowshed, contrary to the provisions of the Dairies, Cowsheds and Milkshops Orders, and this was remedied.

The registration of two purveyors is being withheld until satisfactory storage accommodation for milk has been provided. Three other purveyors registered previous to the Milk and Dairies (Amendment) Act, 1922, have also been requested to provide storage accommodation.

One complaint had to be made of the dirty condition of a dairy and this place has since been cleansed.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOPS ACTS

There are 59 Workshops now on the Register. 103 visits have been made to workshops and it has been found necessary to serve notices in respect to five requiring cleansing and two requiring improvement to the closet accommodation. All these notices have been complied with.

OUT-WORKERS PREMISES.

Five lists of Out-workers have been received relating to 12 workers. All the premises were visited and found to be satisfactory.

WATER SUPPLY.

Fifteen samples of water have been taken from 15 surface wells, serving 39 houses. 13 of these samples, serving 36 houses, were found on analysis to be unsatisfactory and the owners communicated with. 25 of the houses have been provided with a supply from the town mains. One surface well serving 2 houses—beyond the extent of the town mains has been cleansed and a new pump installed.

The water from the town mains has been analysed quarterly and has been found to be quite satisfactory.

No shortage of water has occurred during the year. Good progress has been made in the sinking of the Artesian Well, which when completed will further insure the town supply.
