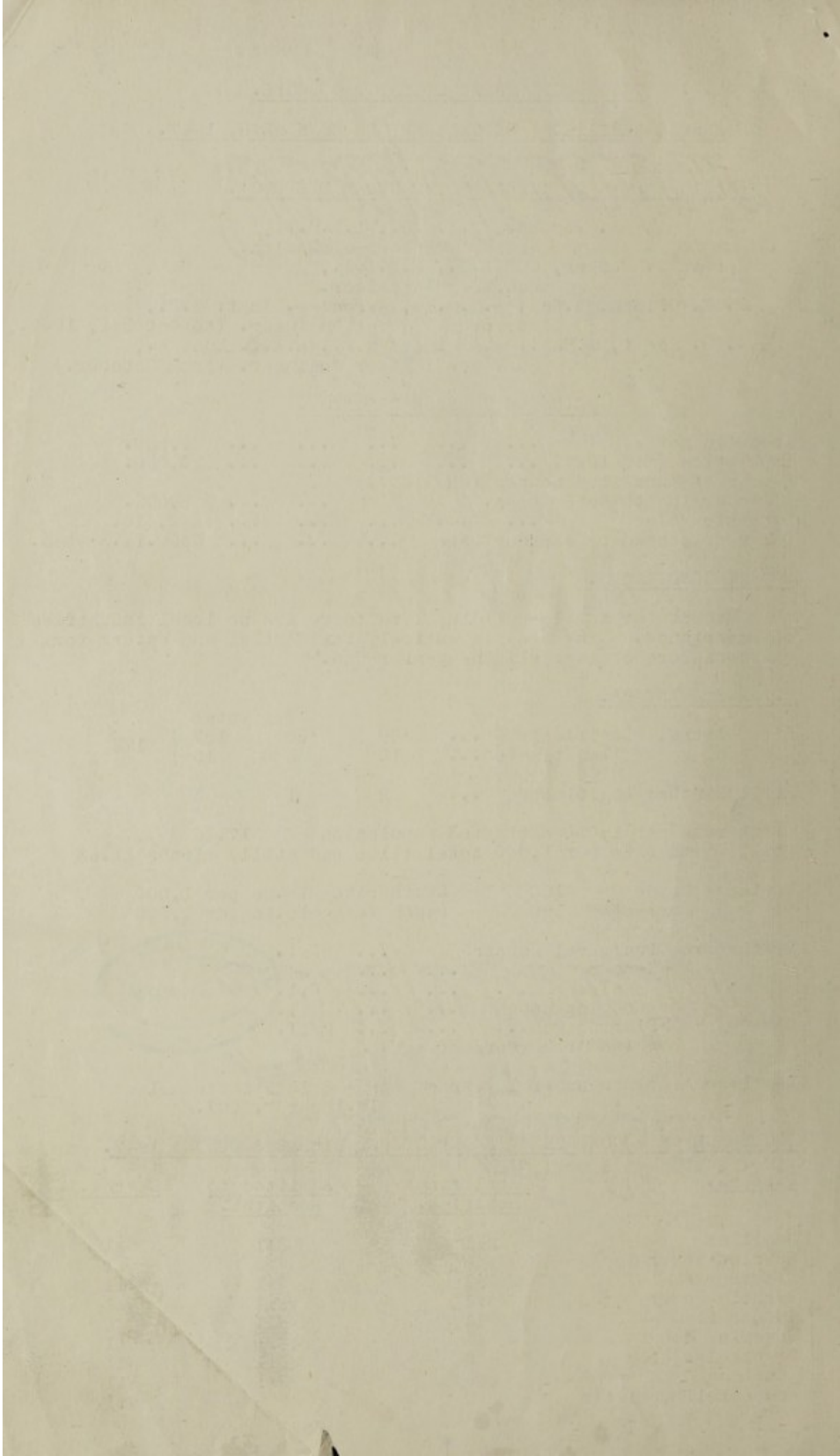

SANITARY INSPECTOR'S REPORT, 1947.

I am informed by the Sanitary Inspector that during the year he has made a total of 2,680 Inspections and visits in connection with his official duties.

These are divided as follows:-

HOUSING. During the year 35 new houses on the Council's Housing Sites were erected and occupied, and 16 families were placed in requisitioned accommodation. The list of applicants per premises under the control of the Council showed no reduction,

but rather increased during the year.

FOOD.

No slaughtering (except occasional slaughter of pigs) took place in the District, all meat being obtained from the Ministry of Food's Centralised Slaughtering Depots, but supervision of food premises was maintained and a total weight of 4,042 lbs. of foodstuffs was condemned as unfit for human consumption.

SHELLFISH. Toward the end of the year, samples of Mussels obtained from the River Beches and laying beds were taken, and proved unsatisfactory. Investigations were carried on into 1948.

REFUSE COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL.

Is under the control of the Public Health Department. Collection of refuse once weekly from private houses, and twice weekly from hotels and boarding houses, etc., is executed by two Karrier "Bantam" Refuse Vehicles. Tipping, by controlled methods, is at the Council's tip at Broadmeadow, which it is proposed eventually to convert to an extensive levelled area, capable of accommodation football grounds, cricket pitches, etc., which are badly needed in the District.

SALVAGE.

During the year intensive efforts were made to increase the amount of salvage recovered, particularly paper, and a total weight of 76½ tons of the latter was collected, baled and sold. Other salvage reclaimed were Iron, Rags and Bones.

Collection is by means of two trailers attached to the Refuse Collection vehicles, so that all premises are visited weekly, and in addition a special collection is made from shops, hotels, etc., Baling and storage is carried out at the Salvage Depot at the Broadmeadow Refuse Tip.
